

The International Foundation Year (IFY)



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Academic: Students normally need to have a minimum of 12 years of schooling with good grades.

English language: IELTS 5.0 (minimum 5.0 in writing) or other equivalent SELT.

COURSE LENGTH

Three terms: September to June or January to August

AGE

Students must be at least 16 years old at the start of the International Foundation Year.

HOURS OF STUDY

16 hours per week, 8 hours for English and 4 for each academic module.

The International Foundation Year is a three-term programme which will provide you with the academic and English language skills required to succeed at undergraduate level. Taught by Study Group, experts in preparing international students for university in the UK and taught at the International Study Centre on the Royal Holloway campus, it is the ideal pathway to integrating with direct-entry students.

During the International Foundation Year you will specialise in your chosen field of study, but will also be introduced to a variety of related modules, giving you the ability to progress to combined degree courses. This also allows you the unique opportunity to broaden your horizons and build on your existing academic knowledge.

HOW TO GET THERE

Heathrow Airport is about seven miles from Royal Holloway and Gatwick is 35 miles away. Taxis are available at both airports, which you can organise in advance via the International Admissions Centre.

Royal Holloway is a part of the University of London, which means students can register as members of the Senate House Library. This central London resource offers further research for those studying Arts, Humanities and Social Science subjects.
