







EIC: your pathway to a degree from Edinburgh Napier University

EIC is an Associate College of Edinburgh Napier University providing access to programmes which lead to internationally recognised Honours and Master's degree awards. EIC provides a fantastic learning environment to start your UK study and will equip you with the skills and experience needed to excel in your studies.

Undergraduate programmes

EIC offers access to a wide range of undergraduate programmes in Business, Computing, Engineering, Life Sciences, Tourism, Festival and Events Management. EIC offers access to postgraduate programmes with entry through our Pre-Master's stage which lead to: Accounting and Finance, Business and Management, Tourism and Festivals and Events Management, Film and MBA. With three intakes per year you have the flexibility to start your studies at the most suitable time.

An undergraduate programme is a single course comprising of a number of study stages. After successfully completing the four year programme you will be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours from Edinburgh Napier University. You also have the option of graduating with a Bachelor's degree after three years of study. This programme

structure allows you to start your university studies directly after High School and the Scottish education system means you do not need to complete a Foundation course.

In your first stage (Year 1) at EIC you will experience University life, but with smaller class sizes and additional academic contact hours. The learning experience at EIC will develop your knowledge and understanding of your chosen subject and prepare you for Year 2 at the University.

Postgraduate programme

The postgraduate programme is a single course comprising two stages of study. When you successfully complete the programme, you will be awarded a Master's degree from Edinburgh Napier University – a qualification that is highly sought after by employers.

Our Pre-Master's is Stage 1 of the postgraduate programme. It is designed to prepare international students who do not qualify for direct entry to Edinburgh Napier University Master's degrees.

Undertaking the Pre-Master's stage will allow you to adjust to the rigorous research and independent study requirements of a postgraduate degree and help you get the most out of your master's studies.

Assessment for most modules is continuous, and includes examinations, assignments and a dissertation.


EIC is committed to providing access to educational programmes with exceptional student support services. With EIC you have the best chance of academic and personal success.

English language

English language courses are available for those students that need to improve their English before enrolling on an undergraduate or postgraduate programme. These courses are taught at Edinburgh Napier University.

There are three English Language courses available, for 6 weeks, 12 weeks and 47 weeks depending on your level of English.

You can start Intensive English Language in September, February or June.



Our commitment to student support

Orientation and enrolment

The orientation program at EIC is a great opportunity for you to make new friends and meet the staff at the College. Enrolment at EIC takes place at the very beginning of the semester. Once you have enrolled you can join your classmates and will have full access to both EIC and Edinburgh Napier University facilities including; 24 hour computer suites, library resources and student support.





BEng (Hons) Energy and Environmental Engineering

The BEng (Hons) Energy and Environmental Engineering is an industry driven programme equipping students with professional expertise in energy generation and management. The degree provides a solid basis for efficient fossil fuel management, but also places particular focus on renewable energy sources including:

- solar heating and electric systems design and specification
- wind turbine design and selection
- hydro turbine selection & design

Students will study modules including Advanced Energy Systems, Renewable Energy and Sustainability, Energy Systems Design and Mechanics & Thermo Fluids.

Film

Located within the school of Arts and Creative Industries and taught at the Screen Academy Scotland, Edinburgh Napier University's degree in Film has been designed to help students embark on a career as a professional film–maker in disciplines such as Directing, Cinematography, Editing, Sound or Producing.

Employment and career options

On completion of this course, graduates are expected to be ready to take up an entry level job in the industry, or, in the case of outstanding students, set themselves up as an independent practitioner as either director, producer, cinematographer, editor or sound engineer. Screen Academy graduates have had their films screened at festivals in cities around the world, including Venice, Beijing, Kolkata and Edinburgh. Many have gone on to win awards and commissions for TV and feature films projects.

Teaching is through a combination of collaborative, shared modules, and modules that are geared to each individual disciple. Pre-sessional English

Students who are unable to meet EIC's English language entry requirements have the option to study pre-sessional English at the University. The English language courses take place at Edinburgh Napier University's Craiglockhart campus, and successful completion of the English language course guarantees a place on programme of choice. Students studying a one semester pre-sessional course will be given one visa for the duration of their English and academic study.

By completing an English language course you will:

- increase your understanding of English
- improve your pronunciation, grammatical skills and reading comprehension.
- develop a broad, academically useful vocabulary
- improve your ability to participate in seminars and take useful lecture notes
- build on your writing skills for essays, reports and assignments
- become confident in public speaking and delivering presentations



- develop research skills so you can read academic texts, journals and papers efficiently and effectively
- develop the independent study skills required for success in a university environment

- EIC will issue an offer.
- Students accept the offer and pay the deposit to secure the place.
- EIC issues the CAS number which students use to apply for a visa.
- Students submit the visa application which covers studies at both EIC and Edinburgh Napier University.

Unlike many pathway colleges, EIC students can apply for a single visa covering the entire duration of studies in the UK.

EIC has a network of representatives throughout the world that can help with visa application. If a student has applied through an agent or representative, often they will also help with visa applications. For students that apply directly, EIC is always happy to put them in touch with someone in their region. For details please contact the team at EIC.
