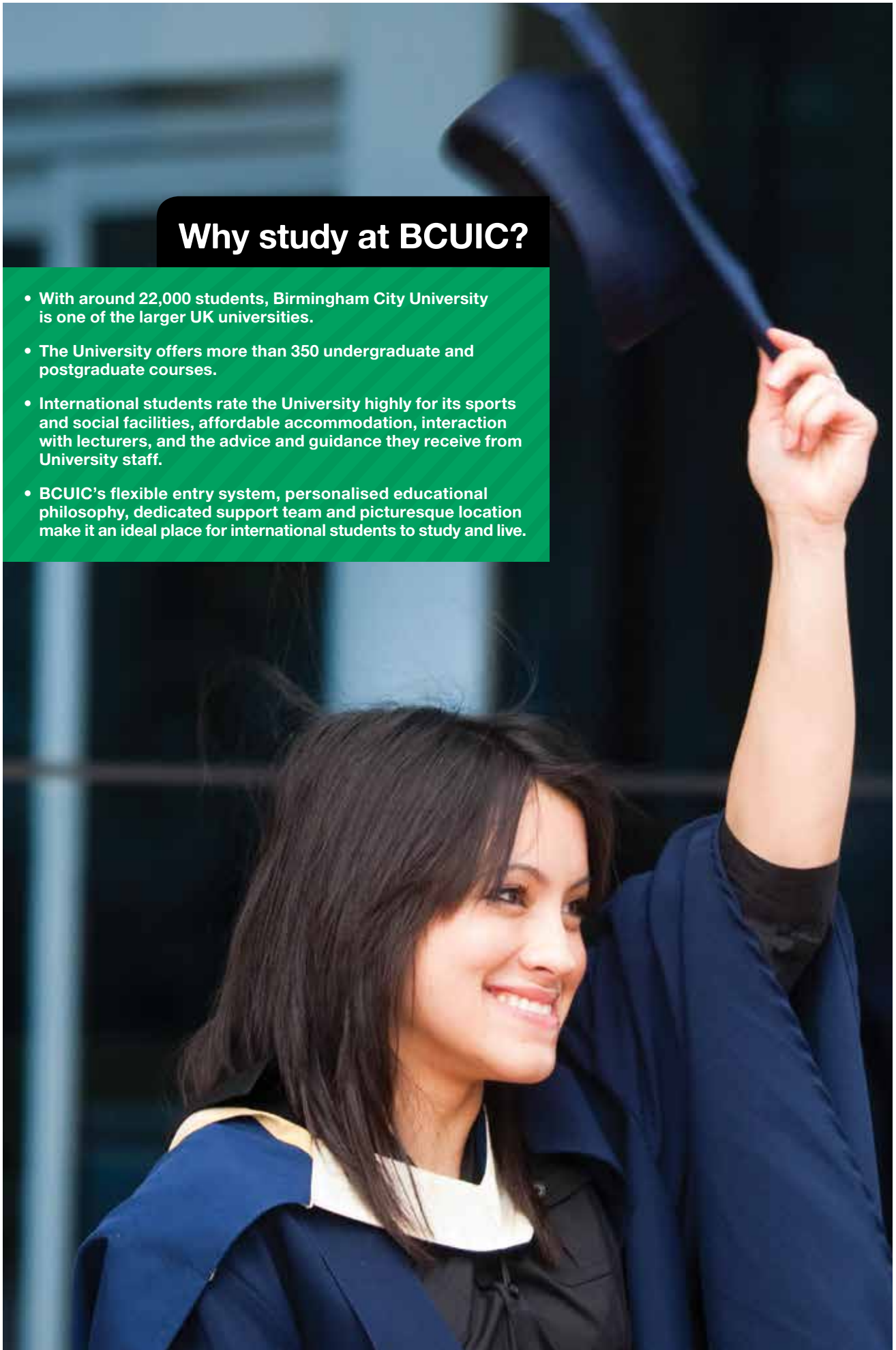

Our reputation for excellence is soaring globally, thanks to the superb links we forge with industry, our international alliances and a vibrant student community from more than 80 countries.

An educational powerhouse

- A centre of excellence in art, design and architecture, business, engineering, technology, built environment, media, education, law, health and training for the professions.
- Several members of our academic staff (currently seven) are National Teaching Fellows – the most prestigious award for excellence in university teaching and learning.
- In the 2008 Research Assessment Exercise (RAE), the University had one of the highest percentages of submitted work rated as ‘world leading’ compared to other modern universities in the UK.

Employability

- Graduate employability is at the heart of what we do. Our pioneering approach includes a wide range of student clinics and guest lectures, placements and community projects.
- Our new Inspired festival brings together the exhibitions and performances which showcase graduate talent to hundreds of thousands of visitors each year.

- 90 per cent of our 2012 graduates had found employment six months after graduating. (Destinations Survey 2011/12).

Facilities

- Vibrant city-based campuses with outstanding specialist facilities; a fantastic place to live and learn.
- The University is mid-way through a £260 million investment plan, including a major expansion of its City Centre Campus, together with ongoing development of existing sites.
- The new, recently opened £62 million Parkside B building at our City Centre Campus, provides a new home for design courses from Birmingham Institute of Art and Design (BIAD) as well as state-of-the-art media facilities, including four industry-standard TV studios with the latest Sony equipment, and ‘green screen’ MILO studio.
- Construction is now under way on Phase 2 of our City Centre Campus development, which will provide a 24,300m² building to house our Business, English, Law and Social Science courses, as well as new library, IT and student support facilities. A third phase of development with additional teaching accommodation at our City Centre and City South campuses, and a new home for Birmingham Conservatoire, will follow in 2017.
- We operate six specialist libraries – including the Mary Seacole Library, one of the biggest health libraries in the UK.
- The £8.5 million Doug Ellis Sports Centre at our City North Campus, features an indoor sports hall, 80 station fitness suite and dance and aerobic studios, as well as changing and social facilities.
- The Pavilion is a £4.5 million, purpose built sports facility featuring 12 grass pitches, an all-weather pitch, two rugby pitches and two cricket nets.

Student support

- Awarded ‘Outstanding Support for Students’ – Times Higher Education Awards 2010.
- Dedicated support services for all students including health, finance, accommodation, disability support and English language skills.
- Overall satisfaction with the quality of our courses was 82 per cent in the 2013 National Student Survey (NSS); with 88 per cent of our students agreeing that staff were good at explaining things and 86 per cent saying staff were enthusiastic about what they taught.
- 100 per cent of students on our Creative Arts and Design (other) courses are satisfied overall, as are 99 per cent of students on our Accountancy courses and 96 per cent of our Finance students.

- The Students’ Union endeavours to create and promote a positive student experience.
- A welcoming environment for all its members, employees and visitors.
- Numerous societies as varied as basketball, dance and cheerleading, debating, chess and rock climbing.
- Plenty of opportunities to join volunteering groups, write for the student magazine or even present on the university TV station.

Gain an advantage

Our graduates gain an advantage in the job market because:

- we work with companies like Apple, Cisco and Cartier to develop cutting edge curricula and to collaborate on course projects
- we attract the best staff – including both academic experts and experienced business leaders with the latest knowledge and industry contacts
- we offer students opportunities for work placements, Erasmus years and sandwich courses
- we operate an ‘employer mentoring scheme’, which gives second and third year students the chance to learn from employers or successful alumni

- Many of our courses are practice-based – most health students, for example, spend 50 per cent of their time in hospitals.

- Our business students benefit from our Student Enterprise Society, which helps them to start businesses together.

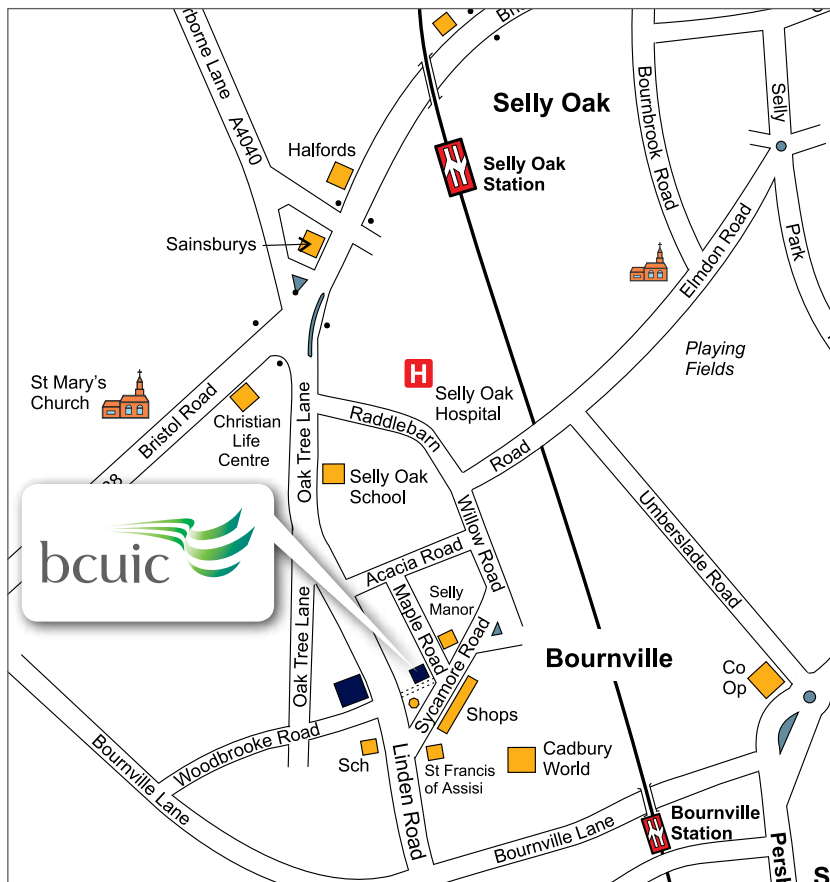

BCUIC location map

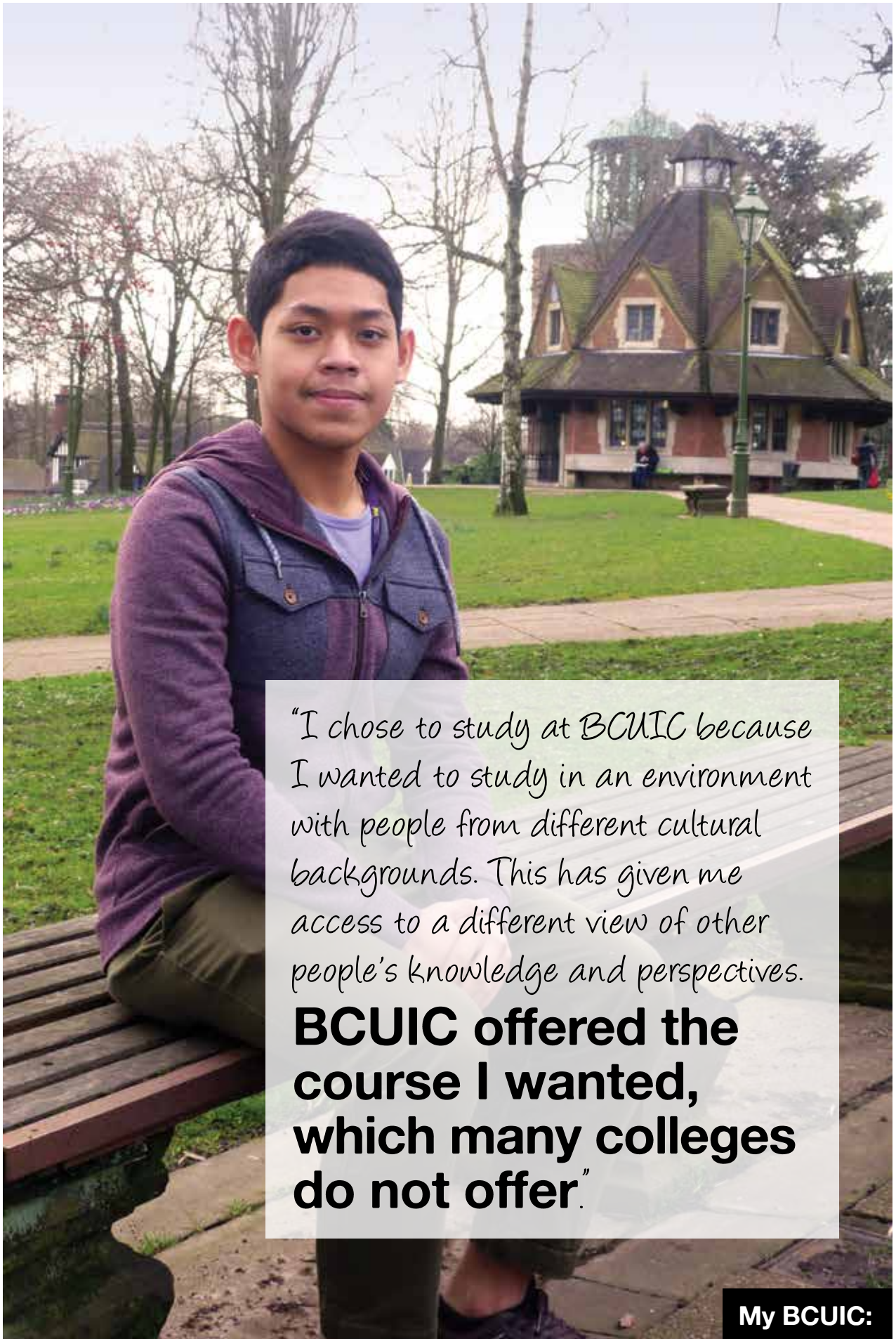

Pathways at Birmingham City University

BCUIC offers a modern and dynamic educational experience, and is committed to providing academic and support services in an environment that encourages you to achieve excellence in your studies. The college offers a range of undergraduate and postgraduate pathways, as well as an English Language course.

Undergraduate pathways

An undergraduate pathway is a single course comprising four stages of study. After successfully completing this programme you will be awarded a Bachelor's degree from Birmingham City University.

University Foundation

The University Foundation programme is Stage 1 of the undergraduate pathway. The transition from high school to university is a big step, perhaps the most important in your life. The staff at BCUIIC understand this, and will provide you with ongoing guidance and support, as well as the knowledge and skills you need. This partnership between you and the BCUIIC staff will make your transition a smooth one.

First Year Degree

The First Year Degree is Stage 2 of the undergraduate pathway. You will experience the first-year curriculum of Birmingham

City University, but with smaller class sizes and extra academic contact hours. The teaching and learning experience will enable you to fully develop your knowledge and understanding of each module to prepare you for Stage 3 (the second year of your chosen degree) and Stage 4 (the final year of your degree pathway).

Second Year Degree and Final Year Degree

The Second and Final Year Degrees are stages 3 and 4 of the undergraduate pathway, and are taught at Birmingham City University.

Postgraduate pathway

A postgraduate pathway is a single course comprising two stages of study. When you successfully complete the pathway you will be awarded a Master's degree from Birmingham City University.

Pre-Master's

The Pre-Master's programme is Stage 1 of the postgraduate pathway. It is one or two semesters long, depending on your chosen pathway. It has been designed to prepare international students who have not qualified for direct entry to Birmingham City University's Master's degrees.

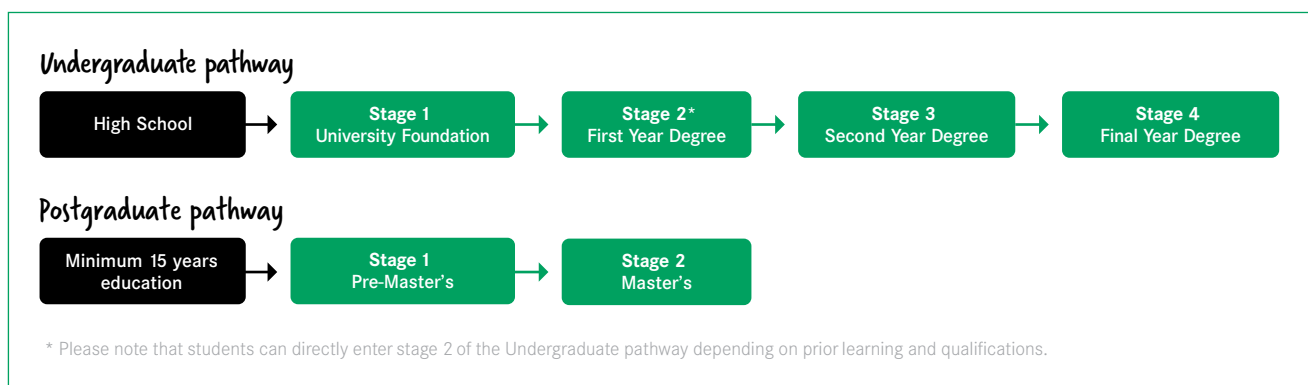
Undertaking the Pre-Master's programme will allow you to adjust to the rigorous research and independent study requirements of a postgraduate degree and help you get the most out of your Master's studies at Birmingham City University.

Master's

The Master's degree is Stage 2 of the postgraduate pathway, and is taught by Birmingham City University.

English language

English language is a full-time course specifically designed for international students who need to improve their level of English before starting undergraduate or postgraduate academic studies. The course suits students with different levels of English competence and is offered by Birmingham City University's Centre for Academic Success.



Student services

Undergraduate pathways at Birmingham City University

There are many advantages of undertaking BCUIC undergraduate pathways. They include a seamless transition from high school to university.

English language requirements

The language of instruction at BCUIIC is English. To attain entry into the undergraduate or postgraduate pathway, students must be able to demonstrate that they have a suitable level of English proficiency. They can do this by obtaining one of the results shown in the table below.

Your English language preparation

If you do not meet the English language requirement for direct entry to your chosen pathway, you can receive the required amount of English language tuition to prepare you for successful entry into your chosen programme at a later date. You can start an English language course in September, November, April or July. The English language training is conducted by Birmingham City University.



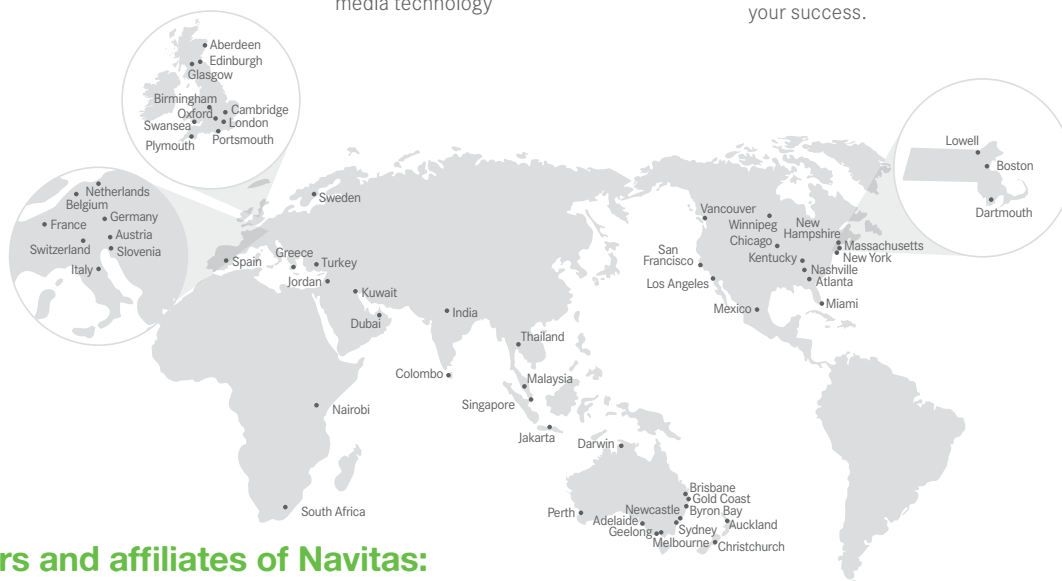

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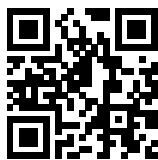
