

Research at the University was rated world-class in the latest survey of research quality in UK universities (Research Assessment Exercise 2008). In Applied Mathematics,

the University of Portsmouth was ranked equal first with the universities of Oxford, Cambridge and Durham and its research deemed to be internationally excellent.

At Portsmouth, whatever you choose to study, you will participate in a challenging academic course and learn in excellent spaces. Significant investment in the campus means that students will benefit from state-of-the-art facilities. In many academic areas, the University has simulated environments providing real life learning experience.

As an international student, you will find all the support you need at ICP in order to be successful in your degree studies, whilst benefitting from small class sizes and additional teaching sessions with highly qualified teachers. 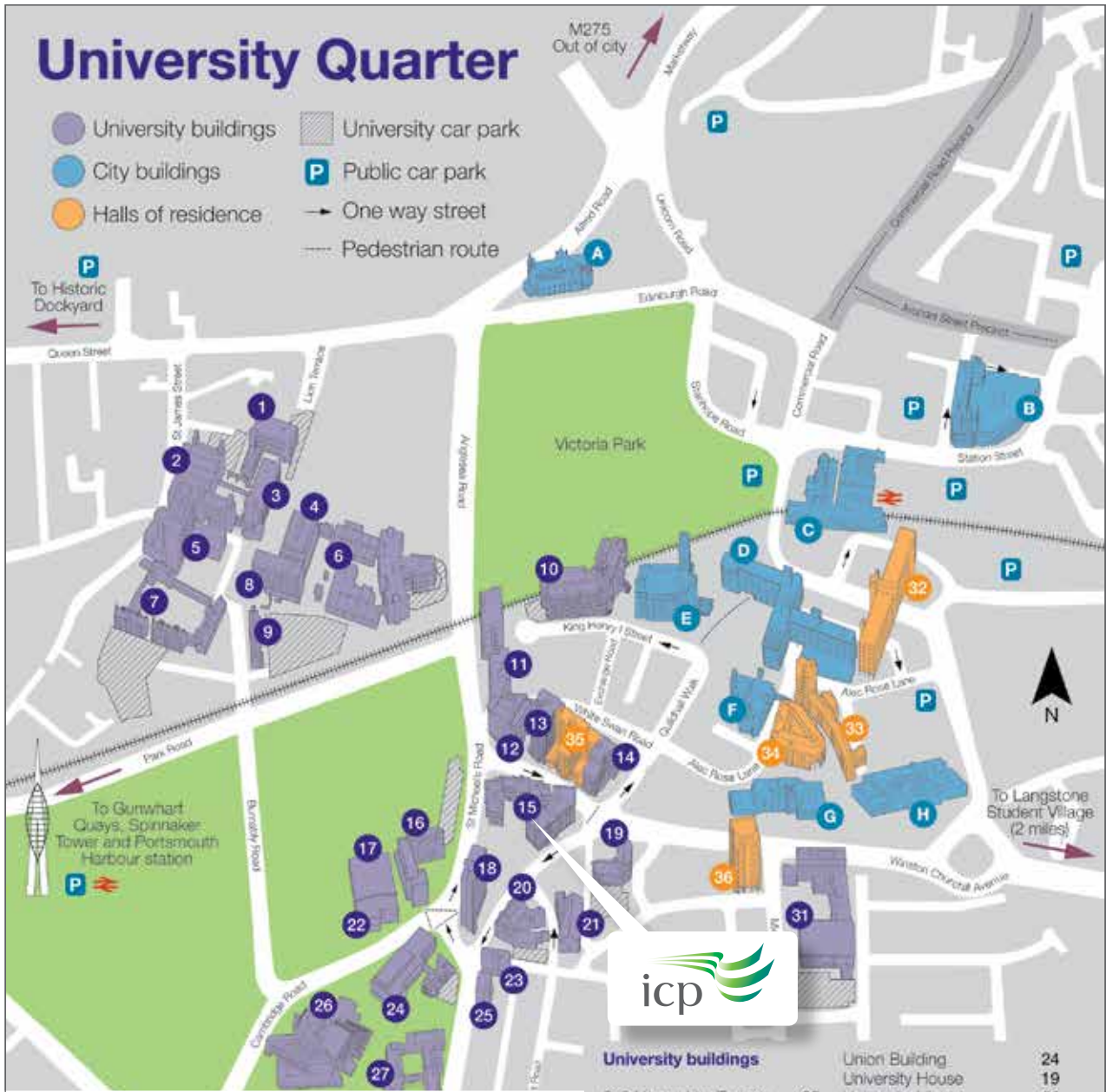
97% of ICP students progressed to the next stage of their degree course at the University of Portsmouth in 2013.

Pathways available at ICP

ICP is an Associate College of the University of Portsmouth, offering students a modern and dynamic educational experience. We are committed to providing educational pathways and support services in an environment that encourages you to achieve excellence in your studies.

Undergraduate pathways

An undergraduate pathway is a single course comprising three or four stages of study. After successfully completing this pathway you will be awarded a bachelor's degree from the University of Portsmouth.

University Foundation

The transition from high school to university is a big step, perhaps the most important in your life, and our University Foundation programme is carefully designed with this in mind. The staff at ICP will provide continuous guidance and support as you gain the necessary knowledge and skills during your pathway. It is this partnership between you and the staff that is vital to ensuring a smooth transition to university education.

University Foundation is normally comprised of four modules each semester, combining academic studies in your subject area with modules to improve your study skills. Each module is tailored towards your chosen undergraduate degree.

Assessment for most modules is continuous, and includes tests, assignments and case study analysis. Most modules have a final examination.

First Year Degree

During the First Year Degree programme, you will experience the first year curriculum of your University of Portsmouth degree, with smaller class sizes and additional academic contact hours. The teaching and learning

experience will help you fully develop your knowledge and understanding of each module to ensure you are entirely prepared for the next stage of your chosen degree pathway.

You will normally undertake four or five modules each semester that mirror the first-year curriculum of the relevant University of Portsmouth bachelor's degree. You will receive extra support through tutorials, individual consultations with teachers, as well as access to computer laboratories.

Assessment for most modules is continuous, and includes tests, assignments and case study analysis. Most modules have a final examination.

Second Year Degree and Final Year Degree

Stage 3 is the second year of your degree and Stage 4 is the third (final) year of your degree. These stages are taught at the University of Portsmouth.

The majority of programmes also offer you the option of an additional sandwich year to your degree, in which you will spend a year working in industry.

Postgraduate pathways

A postgraduate pathway is a single course comprising two stages of study. After successfully completing this pathway you will be awarded a master's degree from the University of Portsmouth.

Did you know?

The University of Portsmouth graduating class of 2014 included 160 students who began their pathways with ICP.

Pre-Master's

The Pre-Master's programme is Stage 1 of the postgraduate pathway. The course is one semester long and has been designed to prepare international students who have not qualified for direct entry to the University of Portsmouth's master's degrees.

A postgraduate master's degree at any university is a significant step up from undergraduate degree studies. Undertaking a Pre-Master's will allow you to adjust to the rigorous research and independent study requirements of a postgraduate degree and get the most out of your master's studies at the University of Portsmouth.

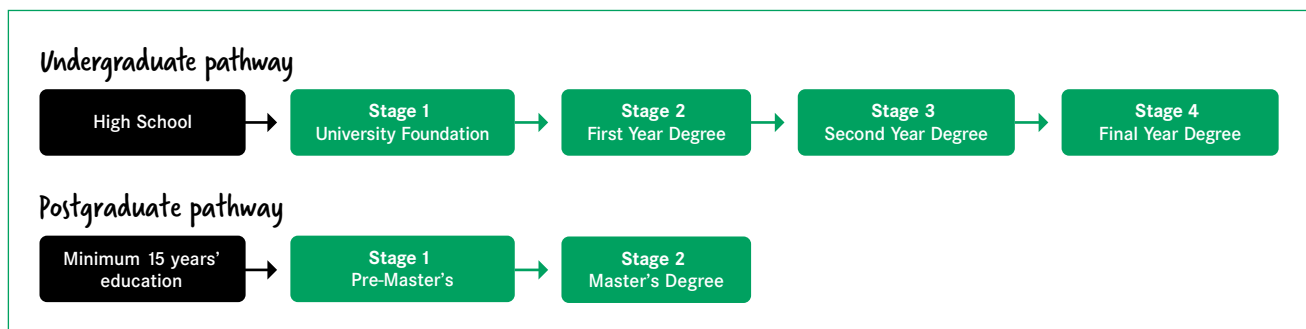
Whilst studying at ICP, you will cover a series of modules that will prepare you for a seamless progression to your chosen master's degree. All modules include core academic skills relevant to postgraduate study.

Assessment for most modules is continuous and includes tests, assignments and a mini-dissertation. Most modules have a final examination.

English language

English language study at ICP is designed for international students who need to improve their English proficiency before starting their undergraduate or postgraduate studies.

You can begin your English language studies in either the autumn, spring or summer intake. The duration of your English language study will depend upon your current English language competency and the requirements for the academic course you wish to undertake. See page 30 for more information.



Dedicated student support services

Leaving home and moving to a new country can be a challenging step for anyone, however ICP has a dedicated and experienced Student Services team to help you get the very best out of your time in Portsmouth. Our goal is to help you to overcome any difficulties you might encounter and provide you with all the support you need to succeed in your studies.

Support network

Welfare weeks

Cultural Awareness Week

One of the truly exciting opportunities available to you at ICP is to study alongside students from a huge variety of backgrounds. Cultural Awareness Week is a week long series of student led activities through which student can share elements of their cultures with other international students. It is a great opportunity to relax and make friends from around the world.

Common Room

The Common Room is a comfy hub where students can relax during breaks, purchase a snack or just hang out with friends.

Group study rooms

ICP have two group study rooms which students can book at their leisure. The rooms provide a great opportunity to revise together, practice presentations or to work on a group project.

'Give it a go' sessions

Run by the Students' Union, 'Give it a go' sessions are a great chance for students to try out a huge range of interesting and diverse activities. ICP students have used them to try activities from ceramics and pottery to voluntary work.

University preparation

In in order to help to make your transition between study stages as seamless as possible, we arrange a variety of welcome days, guest lectures, meetings and information sessions for students who are due to progress. These sessions serve as an introduction to life within a university department and help to make the move as smooth as possible.



Accommodation support

ICP have a designated accommodation officer who can help you find accommodation and support you with any issues you may have.

Religious facilities

The University of Portsmouth has its own chaplaincy that offers a space to relax, meet friends and host religious events. The chaplaincy also includes an Islamic prayer room and offers information on other support services.

In addition, Portsmouth has a number of other places of worship within walking distance of ICP, including three mosques, a Roman Catholic and an Anglican Cathedral.



Portsmouth: study on the glorious south coast of England

Portsmouth is a lively and cosmopolitan city on the south coast of England and only 90 minutes from central London. It is a great place to live, work and study. The city is compact – everything you could possibly need is within easy reach.

Location

Portsmouth is the UK's only island city and is within easy reach of central London. Situated on the south coast, Portsmouth has much lower rainfall than the national average, and is one of the sunniest cities in the UK.

A city rich in history

Home to the Royal Navy, Portsmouth is proud of its maritime heritage. The Historic Dockyard houses some of the world's most famous warships, including Nelson's HMS Victory and King Henry VIII's Mary Rose which is housed in a state-of-the-art museum newly opened in 2013. Celebrated people born in Portsmouth include engineer Isambard Kingdom Brunel and author Charles Dickens (whose birthplace is now a museum), while fellow authors HG Wells, Arthur Conan Doyle and Rudyard Kipling all called Portsmouth home at one time.

Getting around

The city is compact and flat – perfect for cycling – and everything is close by so it is easy to get around. This can significantly reduce your travel expenses, plus as an ICP student your campus card will give you access to a free bus service provided by the University of Portsmouth.

If you wish to travel further afield for your adventures, Portsmouth is one of the best connected ports in the UK. It has regular passenger ferries to the Isle of Wight, the Channel Islands and continental Europe, as well as an airport just 20 miles from the city. In addition to being within easy reach of London, Portsmouth also sits close to the picturesque countryside of southern England, with rolling green hills and typical English woodland.

Cost of living

Portsmouth is an affordable city in which to live and study, close to London but with a cheaper cost of living. Aside from your

tuition costs, you will need to budget for a minimum of £7,380 per year to cover your living expenses while studying in the UK.

Shopping and entertainment

If you like shopping, you'll love Portsmouth. The city boasts three main shopping areas, including the £200 million waterside complex at Gunwharf Quays, home to over 80 designer outlets, 30 restaurants and bars, a multi-screen cinema, and a bowling complex. Here you can visit the impressive Spinnaker Tower – the UK's tallest accessible structure outside London – which offers stunning views over the city and beyond.

Other events include the Portsmouth Film Festival in October and the Victorian Festival of Christmas, held every November. However, the highlight for many students comes in the summer when the music festival season begins. The Victorious Festival takes place in the city in August, but you can catch some of the world's top artists and DJs at The Isle of Wight Festival in June or at Bestival in September. Recent Bestival headliners have included Elton John, Stevie Wonder, Dizzee Rascal, Fatboy Slim, Pendulum and Snoop Dogg.



Sport

Sport is central to life in Portsmouth and has put the city on the map. The city hosts world-class sailing events and boasts its own football team – Portsmouth FC – who were the proud winners of the world-famous FA Cup in 2008. The University of Portsmouth also offers excellent sports facilities; its Athletic Union has over 50 different clubs that ICP students can join, with everything from football, tennis and cricket to skydiving, skiing and sailing.

Accounting and Finance at the University of Portsmouth is ranked 31st in the UK (The Complete University Guide 2014). You will get an excellent start to your career in finance or accountancy, thanks to the exceptional level of teaching and the high number of professional exemptions available.

Potential career paths

Audit and assurance, commercial banking, corporate finance, financial analysis, financial planning, forensic accounting, insurance, investment banking, management accounting, money management, real estate, taxation.

Average starting salaries

According to The Complete University Guide 2013, average graduate starting salaries are:
Accounting and Finance: £21,383

Students choosing an undergraduate pathway in Accounting and Finance can take advantage of Portsmouth Business School's top-of-the-range facilities and strong affiliations with local businesses and the wider community. Professional accreditation is a key indicator of programme quality. Up to nine exemptions from the professional examinations of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) are available to students graduating with a BA (Hons)

Accounting with Finance degree. This is the highest number of exemptions available at any UK university, and one of the many reasons why this degree is an excellent choice for those considering a career in accountancy. This degree also allows up to five exemptions from Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) papers at Certificate level, and up to two exemptions at Operational level and Management level.

Business

One-year placement option available

Portsmouth Business School lies at the heart of the University campus and has around 4,000 students. It is housed in a striking purpose-built facility opened by the Governor of the Bank of England in 2004 and is one of the largest and most successful business schools in the region.

Advertising, account management, business ownership and management, financial management, hotel management, marketing management, market research, personnel and human resource management, recruitment consulting, restaurant management.

Average starting salaries

According to The Complete University Guide 2013, average graduate starting salaries are:

Business: £22,103

In the National Student Survey (2013), the University of Portsmouth scored 88 per cent for overall student satisfaction in the broad Business and Management category which places Portsmouth Business School as one of the best business schools on the south coast of England. 90 per cent of all Business and Management graduates were in a professional/managerial job within six months of graduation (HEFCE 2013).

In addition, the BA (Hon) Marketing degree allows students up to three exemptions from Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) papers

at Certificate level, and up to two exemptions at Diploma level. This allows students graduating from these degrees to get an excellent head start in their professional qualifications.

In all University of Portsmouth business degrees students develop a range of skills valued by employers such as communication, teamwork, career planning and time management. Each programme has a strong contemporary feel and relates business theories and concepts to the practical issues facing managers in the 21st century.

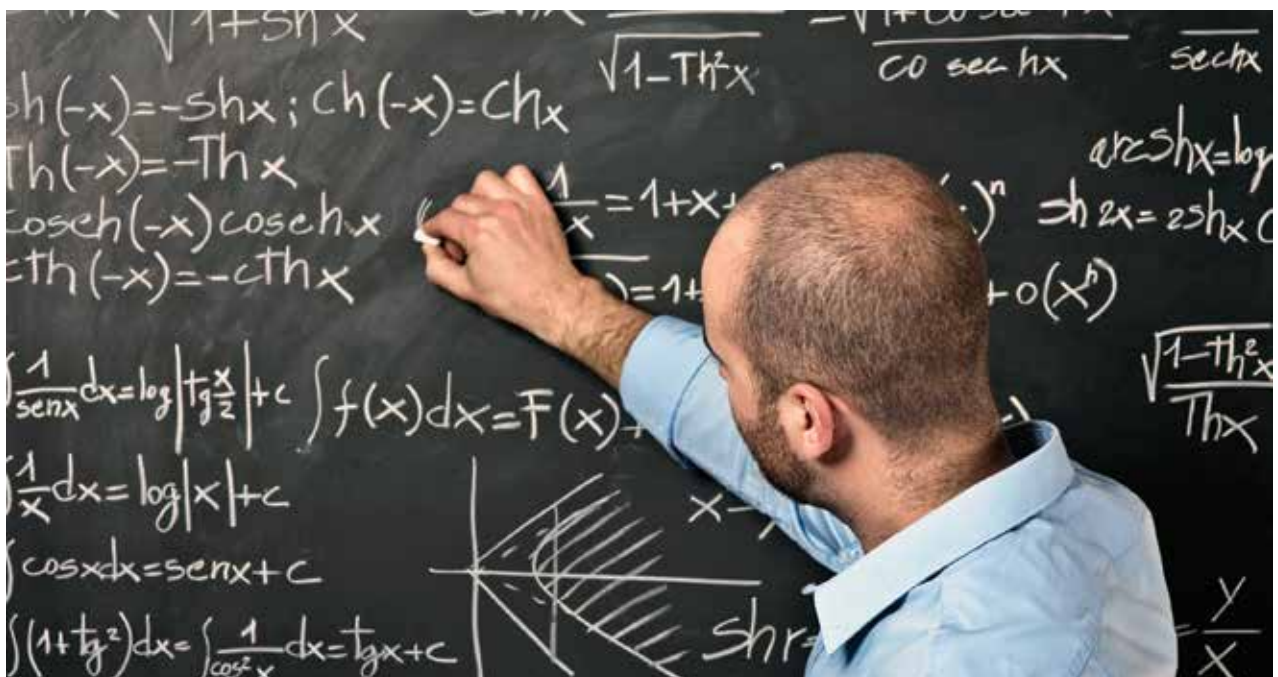

Rapid developments in life sciences mean that our lives will be increasingly influenced by DNA-based technologies. With an ever-expanding population, we also need biologists capable of cataloguing and conserving plant and animal life on earth. At the University of Portsmouth you will receive an excellent scientific education from academics who are leading researchers in their field, equipping you with the theoretical knowledge and practical skills that will allow you to excel in your field of specialisation.

School of Earth and Environmental Sciences

In many parts of the world, geological hazards such as landslides, earthquakes and tsunamis present major risks to lives, infrastructure and livelihoods. Earth and Environmental Sciences courses will teach you how the Earth works, how it has changed and how this information can be used. Dedicated staff will show you how to 'read' the landscape to understand how it was formed and how life evolved on this planet.

School of Pharmacy and Biomedical Sciences

The University of Portsmouth has a reputation for having one of the best schools of pharmacy in the country, with the BSc (Hons) Pharmacology ranked 15th in the UK (The Times Good University Guide 2014). The school's laboratory facilities have recently been boosted by an investment of £1 million to include an aseptic manufacturing area and equipment for a full range of pharmaceutical, chemical and biomedical techniques. Teaching and research within the school are highly rated by

external review bodies, with the school's teaching scoring a full mark of 24 in the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education's Subject Review and its research receiving a grade 5 in the Research Assessment Exercise for 2008.

Department of Psychology

A range of research centres and expert research groups, led by internationally renowned academics, underpins the teaching of the department's courses. Psychology and Forensic Psychology students who graduate with the necessary marks will be eligible for graduate membership of the British Psychological Society (BPS) and Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership, which is the first step towards becoming a chartered psychologist.

Department of Sport and Exercise Science

Master of Business Administration (MBA)

This career-enhancing course is designed for both practitioners and newly graduated students with relevant work experience who wish to make a career in public administration and related areas, whether this is in central, regional or local government or in private and voluntary sectors in partnerships with governments. MSc Business and Management

At Portsmouth, the study of politics and international relations explores power – who has it and how they use it in national and global arenas. This means study and research in topics from globalisation to local governance, from economic integration to war and terrorism.

Institute of Criminal Justice Studies

The Institute of Criminal Justice Studies was founded in 1992 and has since become one of the UK's leading centres for research and course provision in criminology, criminal justice and police studies.

With 50 academic staff and more than 1,800 students, the Institute is one of the largest departments of its kind and has become an internationally renowned focal point for the multidisciplinary study of crime and criminal justice processes.

It draws together expertise in criminological analysis, applied psychology, police governance and management, victimology, penology, risk, security and international and comparative criminal justice.



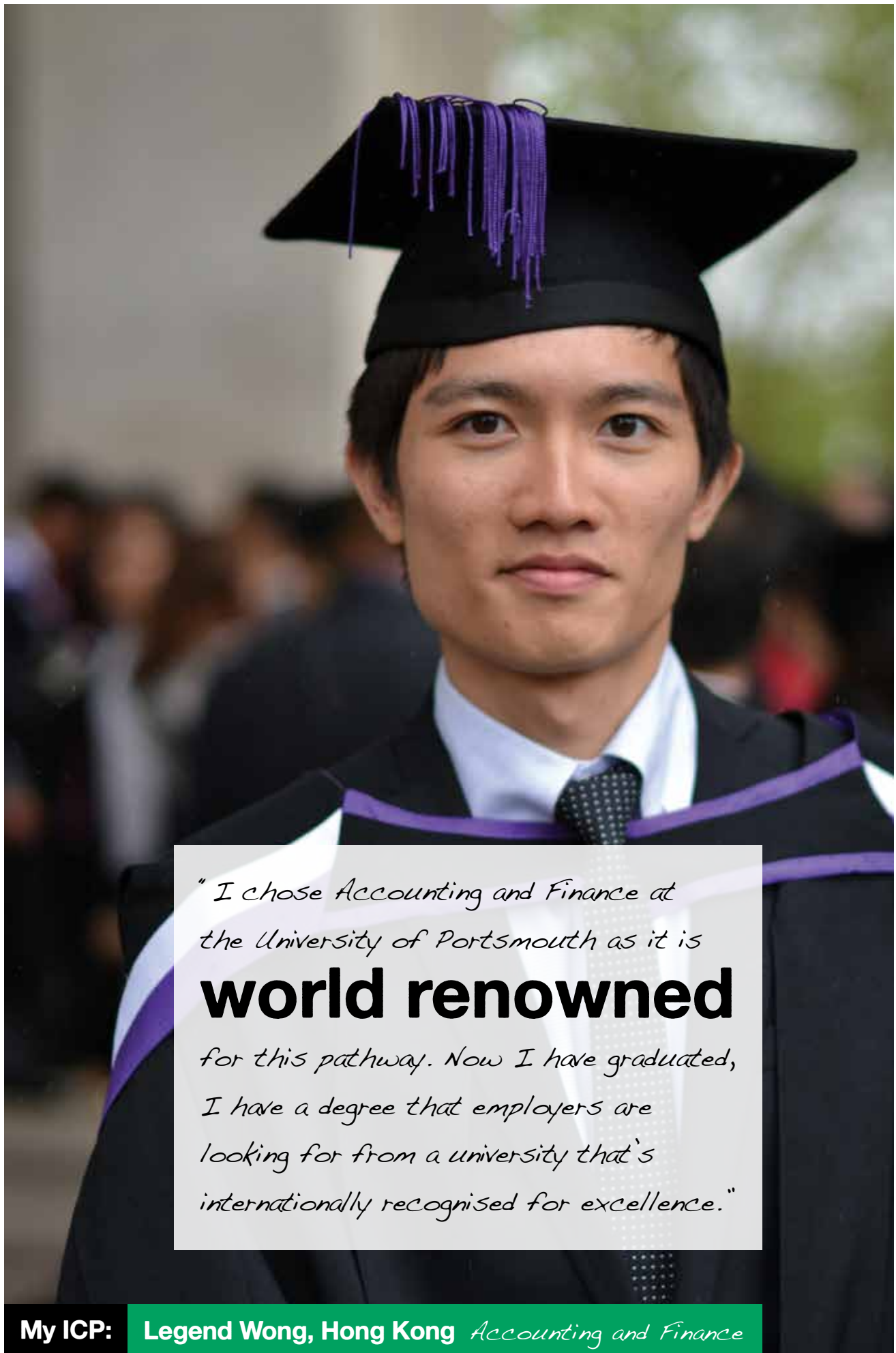

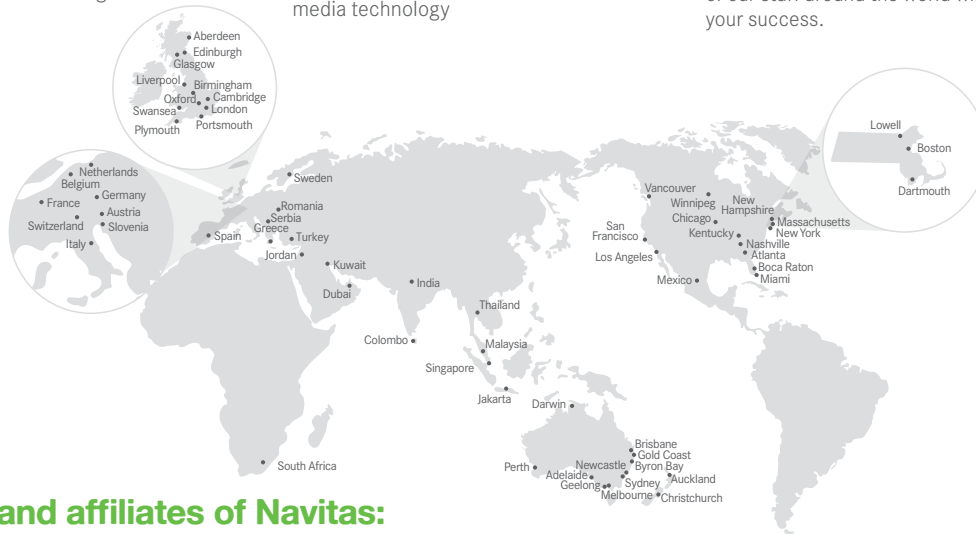
