



The University of South Australia offers more professional education programs than any university in South Australia and is a national leader in collaborative and industry-relevant research. It is home to the state's largest student population of more than 33,000.

Students learn in modern and high quality facilities on each of the four University of South Australia campuses in Adelaide: City West, City East, Magill and Mawson Lakes. The University of South Australia also has two regional sites in Whyalla and Mount Gambier.

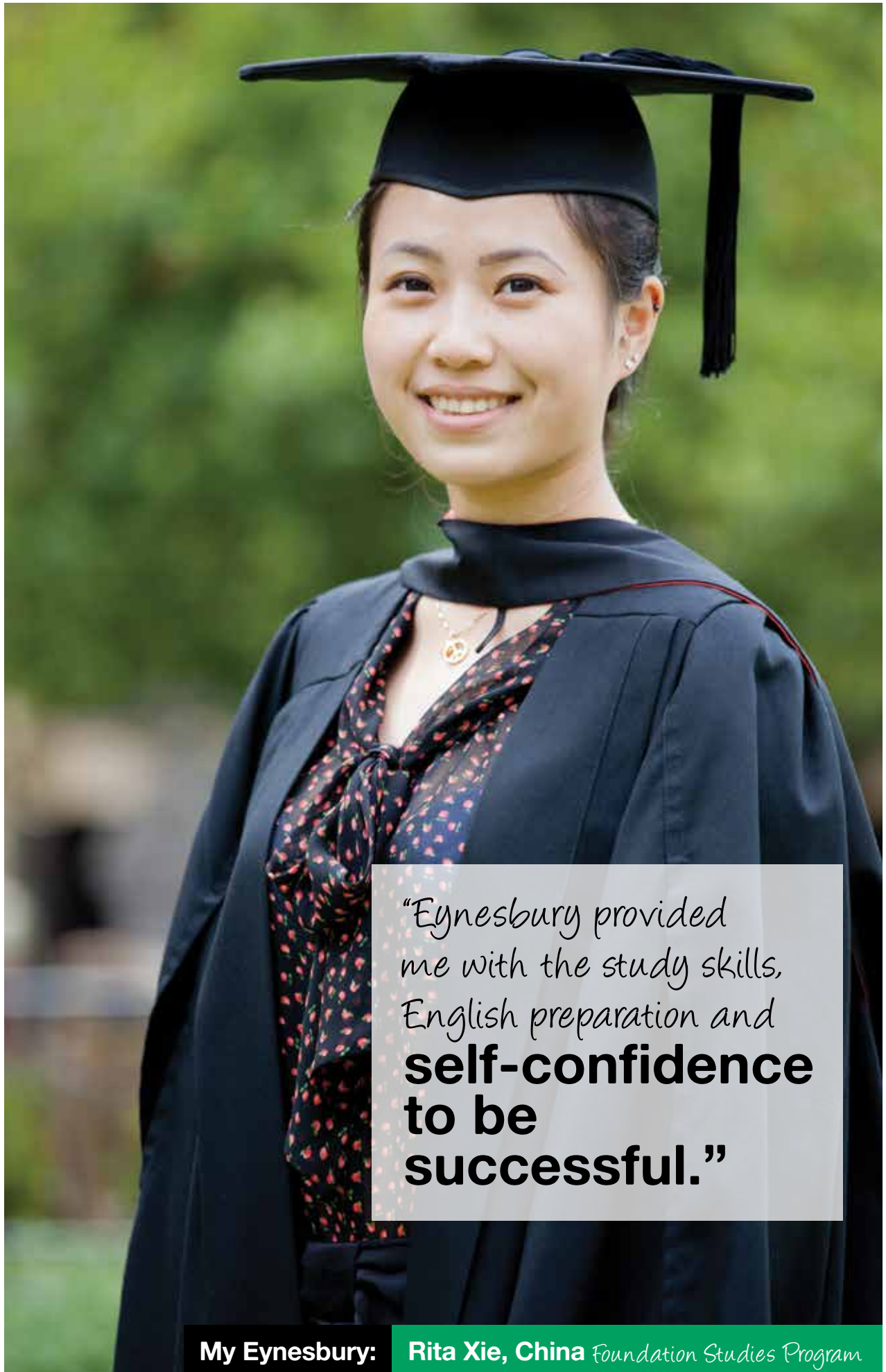

### City campuses

#### City East Campus

Situated in the vibrant heart of Adelaide in the CBD, the City East Campus is located on the corner of North Terrace and Frome Road. The campus offers an abundance of hands-on learning opportunities, services, and social and leisure activities to complement your academic pursuits.

The campus is home to the University's Division of Health Sciences, SAIIBT and the Centre for English Language in the University of South Australia (CELUSA).



#### City West Campus

Located in Adelaide's major arts, culture and entertainment precinct, City West provides a hub for artists and academics alike, and an atmosphere that is ripe for the exploration of ideas and the pursuit of excellence. The campus is located on the western edge of the CBD, just a short stroll along North Terrace from Adelaide Railway Station.

Situated on the campus is the University of South Australia Business School and selected programs from the Division of Education, Arts and Social Sciences.



### Mawson Lakes Campus

Located in one of Adelaide's premier developing suburbs, the Mawson Lakes campus boasts contemporary teaching, learning and state-of-the-art research facilities. The campus is located 20 minutes from the Adelaide city centre, on Mawson Lakes Boulevard in Adelaide's northern suburbs.

### Magill Campus

The campus is host to programs and research in the areas of communication, journalism and media, information studies, education, psychology, social work and human services, international studies and languages.



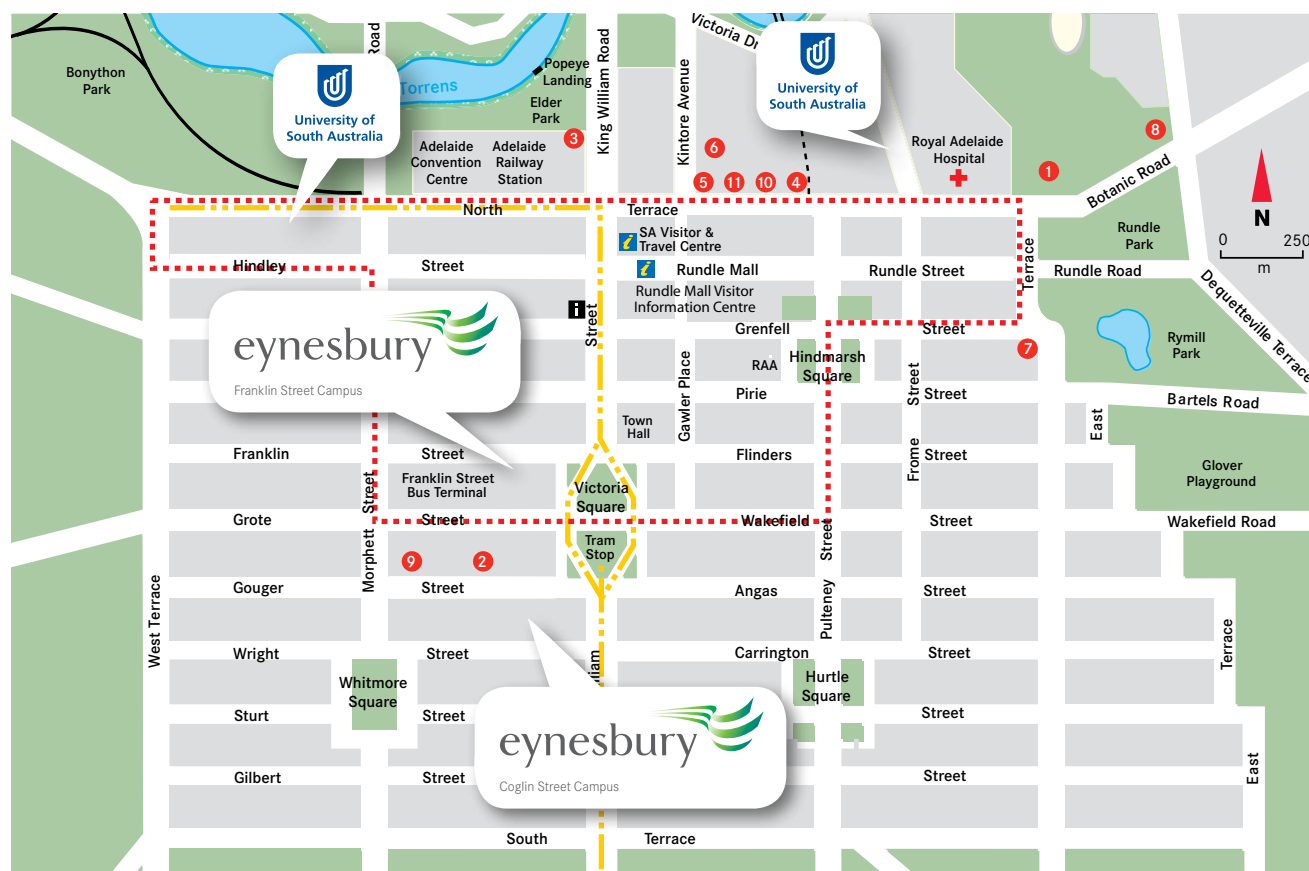

# Pathways to the University of South Australia

Eynesbury is a specialist institution that offers a modern and dynamic learning experience, and is committed to offering choice, diversity and flexibility of pathways in education. Eynesbury offers a range of pre-university, undergraduate and English Language programs.

## Eynesbury Foundation Studies Program

Since 1994 Eynesbury has provided the Foundation Studies Program (FSP) on behalf of the University of South Australia.

Students studying the FSP are given provisional entry into a bachelor degree program of their choice at the University of South Australia. Upon achievement of the required entry score for their nominated degree program, students are given entry into the University for the next intake period.\*

## Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program

The Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program prepares students for entry into an Eynesbury Diploma. It is designed for students who have completed the equivalent of Year 11 at an Australian high school and/or need to undertake further study before starting an Eynesbury Diploma.

## Diploma of Business

The Diploma of Business introduces students to the fundamental knowledge required to successfully undertake a key range of business undergraduate degree programs at the University of South Australia.

## Diploma of Computing and Information Technology

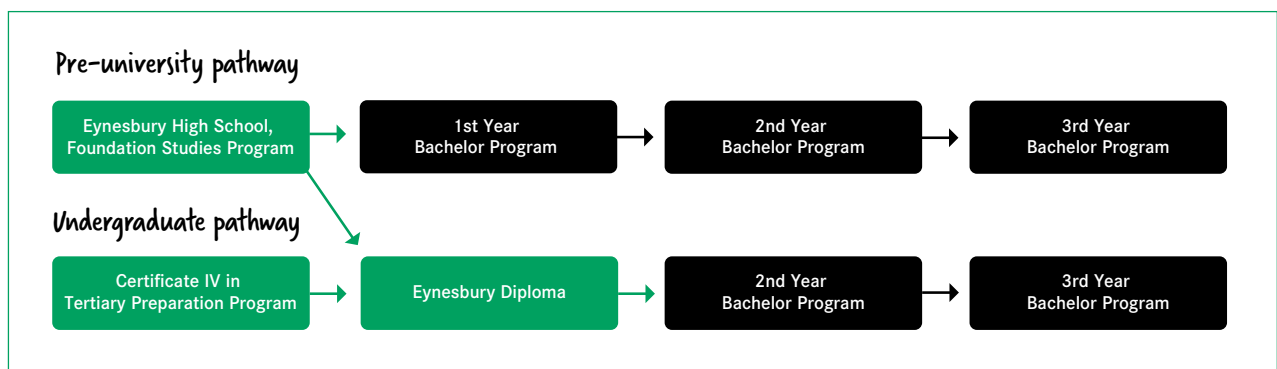

The Eynesbury College Academy of English (ECAE) provides high-quality English Language programs that are taught by qualified Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). ECAE is a member of English Australia and accredited by the Australian Government.

## Program accreditation

Eynesbury is a registered Higher Education Provider, approved by the Australian Government. The College delivers programs which comply with the National Code of Practice for Registration Authorities and Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2007 which is established under the Commonwealth Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000.

# Adelaide: the safe and affordable choice for international students

Adelaide is a safe, friendly, cosmopolitan city with a population of 1.2 million and a relaxed outdoor lifestyle. The city is surrounded by 900 hectares of lush green parklands and is situated only 20 minutes from white sandy beaches.

For three years in succession, Adelaide has remained Australia's most liveable city according to a report released by the Property Council of Australia. Importantly, Adelaide has also been rated Australia's safest city according to statistics compiled for the Suncorp Bank Friendly City Report.

## Things to see and do in and around Adelaide

Adelaide is Australia's festival city and prides itself on art and culture. There is plenty to see and do while living in Adelaide:

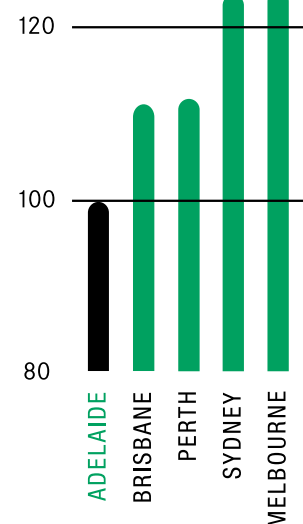
- 25 percent less expensive than living in Melbourne

- Cool winters with no snow at an average maximum temperature of 16°C

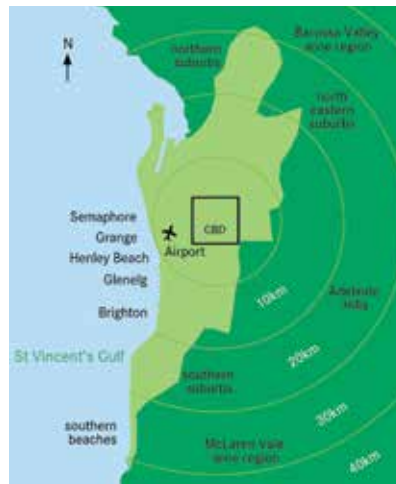
Adelaide's climate is perfect for enjoying outdoor sporting and social activities.

### Extended FSP

The Extended FSP is suitable only for students who need to develop their English language skills or undertake further study in key academic areas. Students in the Extended FSP undertake an additional term (15 weeks) to the Standard FSP students. Upon successful completion of the Extended FSP, students move into the Standard FSP.

## English for General Purposes

English for General Purposes is designed for students who are at a beginner to intermediate level of English. Students with an IELTS of 3.0 or below may commence the English for General Purposes Program prior to starting the English for Academic Purposes program.

- EGP2 (IELTS 3.5 or equivalent)
- EAPP (IELTS 4.0 or equivalent)\*

## Duration

10 weeks for each level

## English for Academic Purposes

The English for Academic Purposes program develops students English Language skills required to succeed at academic study.

## Pearson Versant Test

Students who do not meet the English entry requirements for direct entry into an Eynesbury program via IELTS or TOEFL can sit the Pearson Versant Test. This free online test is used to determine your level of English, and takes approximately 50 minutes to complete. Upon successfully achieving the required English entry score, a student will gain direct entry into their Eynesbury program.#

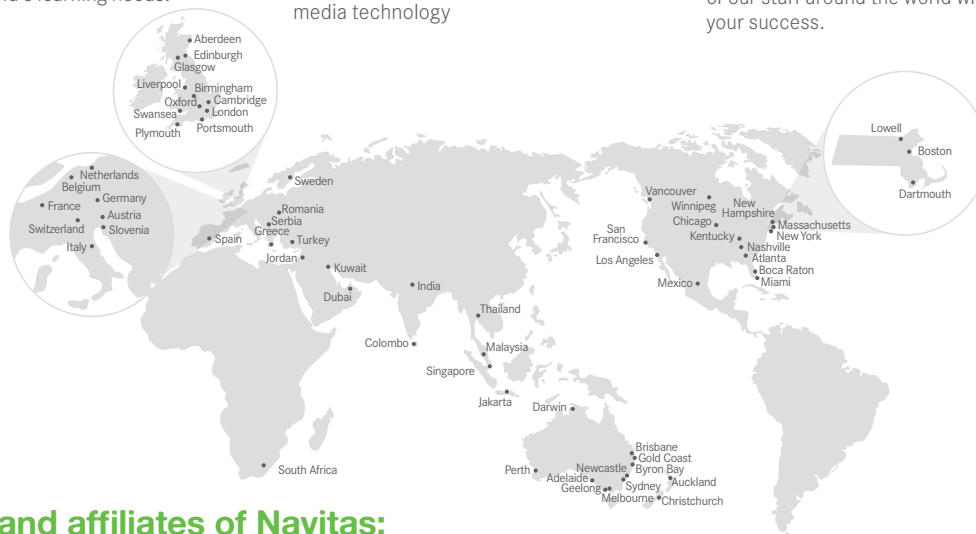
