MIBT: this is your pathway to Deakin University

Your pathway to an exciting career path starts at MIBT. Since 1996, MIBT and Deakin University have been working in partnership to provide degree pathways. These pathways are an ideal alternative for anyone who may not meet the direct entry requirements for an Australian degree.

MIBT pathways can provide your entry point into the first or second year of a bachelor's degree or first year of a master's degree. More than 2,500 Australian and international students currently study at MIBT, and over 90 percent of eligible MIBT graduates proceed to a degree at Deakin University.

As MIBT courses are linked with Deakin University degrees, most students transfer to Deakin after completing their MIBT course. However, MIBT courses are also recognised by universities throughout Australia.

As part of the accreditation process, all MIBT courses are regularly reviewed and revised, so you are guaranteed of their quality and relevance. All courses are registered on the Australian Government's Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) and have been accredited by the appropriate education authorities. MIBT is a member of the Australian Council for Private Education and Training (ACPET), which is the national body for private vocational and higher education providers in Australia.

Why choose MIBT?

- pathway to Deakin University:** MIBT programs provide you with a direct pathway to Deakin University. MIBT is located on Deakin University's Melbourne Burwood Campus and the Geelong Waurin Ponds and Waterfront campuses in Victoria, Australia. As an MIBT student you have access to the full range of services and facilities available on each campus. MIBT also offers the diploma pathway at our offshore campus in Jakarta, Indonesia.
- a supportive learning environment:** MIBT students have access to careers advisory services and health and study support, which help ensure a smooth transition to your Deakin degree. If you need additional academic assistance, you can attend free study support workshops. These workshops focus on areas such as study and writing skills, assignment preparation and examination techniques. As an MIBT student, you will also be taught by highly experienced lecturers, and will have the chance to make friends from all over the world.

- flexible start dates:** MIBT offers three trimesters each year, commencing in March, June and October. With three intakes per year, you can choose to enter a course when it is convenient for you. Trimester dates can be found on page 21.
- fast-track options:** MIBT certificate and diploma courses offer a fast-track option where you can complete a program in eight months rather than 12 months. Some pathway programs add an extra year to your tertiary studies, but this is not the case at MIBT. By choosing a fast-track option, it may be possible to enter university earlier than students studying in a conventional pathway program.
- small lecture and tutorial groups:** Small class sizes are a major benefit of studying at MIBT. Lectures contain an average of 45 students and are complemented by small group tutorials and workshops, so you will receive a high level of academic contact and support.
- additional teaching hours:** In keeping with its supportive approach, MIBT provides more teaching hours per academic unit. Instead of the traditional three hours of teaching, MIBT conducts its classes in four-hour block sessions Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 12.30pm and from 1.30pm to 5.30pm (some units requiring lab sessions may run outside these hours). Limited units may also be offered weeknights from 5.30pm to 9.30pm and on Saturdays from 9.30am to 1.30pm. This extra academic contact in four-hour block sessions will allow you to fully develop your knowledge and understanding of each unit.
- convenient transport:** All MIBT campuses are conveniently located and easily accessible by public transport or car. For more information, on public transport for Melbourne and Geelong visit metlinkmelbourne.com.au.



Our commitment to student support

Orientation and enrolment program

MIBT holds an orientation and enrolment program the week before each trimester. During orientation you will receive valuable information to help you settle in at MIBT, enrol in your classes, create a timetable, receive your student ID card, meet your lectures and make new friends. Airport reception

MIBT has four campus locations. In Australia, MIBT is located on three Deakin University campuses in the state of Victoria. One is in metropolitan Melbourne and the other two are in Geelong. MIBT's fourth campus is offshore in Jakarta, Indonesia.

About Melbourne

Victoria's capital city, Melbourne, is recognised as one of the world's most liveable cities. Ranked the world's most liveable city in from 2011-2013 by the Economist Intelligence Unit survey, Melbourne is a friendly multicultural city, home to people from over 140 nations.

Located on the south-east coast of the Australian mainland on a beautiful inland bay, Melbourne is the gateway to many of Victoria's dramatic coastlines, desert lands, snowfields, countryside and mountains, all of which are an easy drive away. Cosmopolitan Melbourne offers a wide variety of world-class entertainment, quality restaurants, beautiful parks and gardens and excellent shopping.

Known as the sporting capital of Australia, Melbourne hosts international events such as the Formula One Grand Prix, the Grand Slam tennis tournament and test cricket matches, as well as being home to Australian Rules football.

Melbourne's charm and elegance, sophistication and mild climate combine to make it an attractive and desirable city for residents and tourists alike.

About Geelong

Victoria's second largest city, Geelong, is situated on the beautiful Corio Bay and Barwon River, less than one hour from central Melbourne by car or train.

Although it is a city that is full of history, Jakarta sits alongside a modern infrastructure. There are many high-rise buildings, modern hotels and apartments as well as high-end shopping malls.

Climate

Australia

Australia experiences summer from December to February, autumn from March to May, winter from June to August and spring from September to November. Melbourne and Geelong have a similar climate; the weather can sometimes be unpredictable and is often referred to as having 'four seasons in one day'.

Jakarta

The weather in Jakarta is tropical with moderate to high humidity. There are really only two seasons; a rainy season (October to April) and a dry season (May to September). Due to Jakarta's proximity to the equator, temperatures do not vary much. Daytime temperatures rise to about 33°C in the dry season and fall to overnight lows of about 24°C in the rainy season.

Campus locations

Melbourne Burwood Campus

The Melbourne Burwood Campus is Deakin's largest campus, with more than 19,200 students and is located approximately 16 kilometres from Melbourne CBD.

- **MIBT courses taught at this campus:** Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program, Diplomas of Commerce, Computing, Health Sciences, Management, Media and Communication, Postgraduate Qualifying Program.

Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus

The Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus is Deakin's second largest campus, with more than 5,600 on campus students.

Situated at the western edge of the city, it features expansive landscaped grounds and extensive sporting facilities.

- **MIBT courses taught at this campus:** Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program, Diplomas of Engineering, Health Sciences, Science.

Geelong Waterfront Campus

The Geelong Waterfront campus is located on Corio Bay in the central business district of Geelong. Originally built in 1893, the buildings have been extensively renovated to create a modern and impressive campus centre. It hosts more than 3,400 students.

- **The MIBT Diploma of Commerce is taught on this campus.**

Jakarta Campus

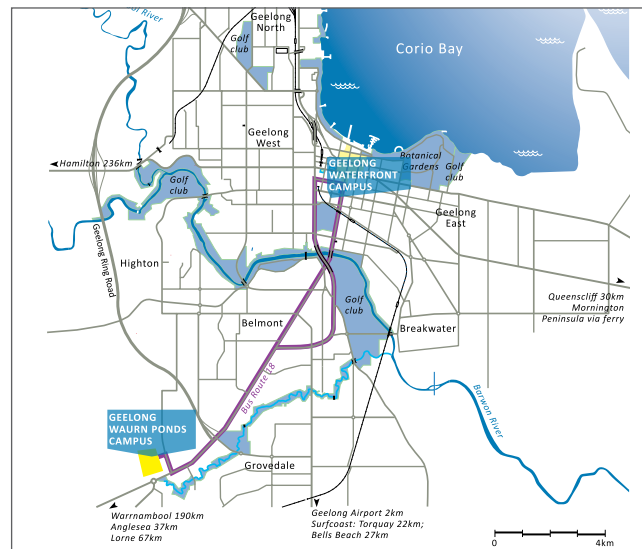
The MIBT Jakarta campus is located in central Jakarta. It is not conducted on a Deakin University campus like the Australian campuses, however students still have access to excellent facilities. 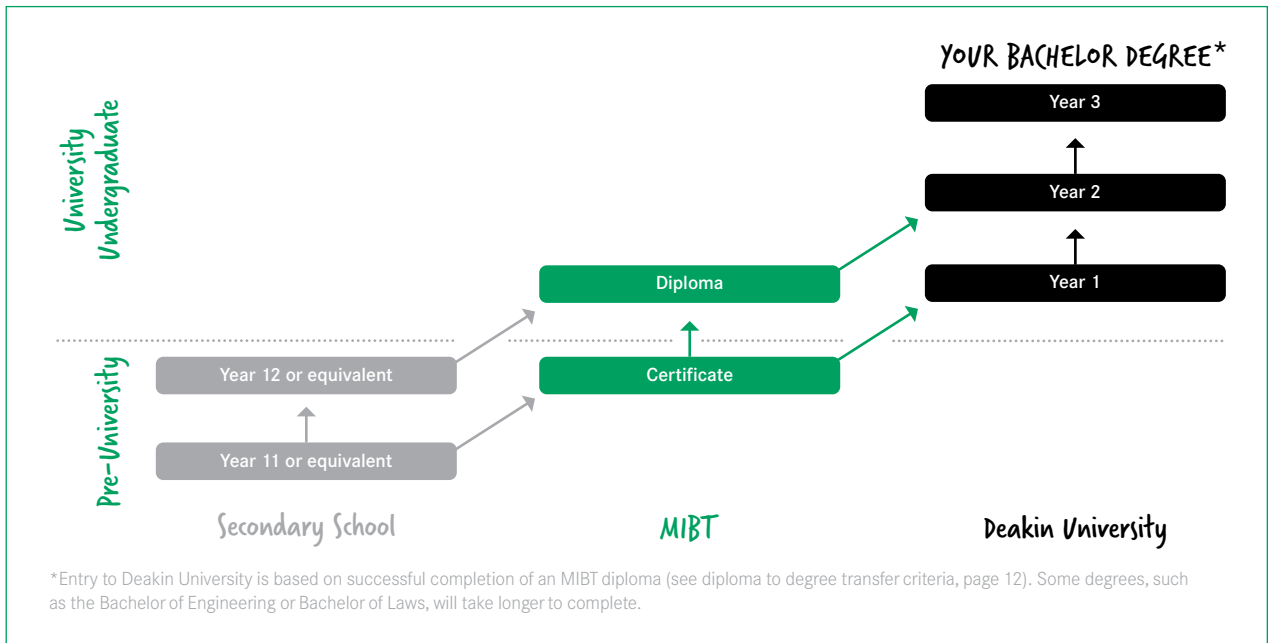

Pathways to undergraduate studies

An MIBT undergraduate pathway program is the link between your previous study and a university degree. Depending on your academic background, you can start your pathway to undergraduate studies through either the pre-university course — Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program — or a university-level diploma course. Unlike some pathway programs, an MIBT diploma prepares you for direct entry to the second year of a bachelor’s degree.



Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program

This course is equivalent to upper secondary school (Year 12) and university foundation programs. It aims to prepare you for further study in an MIBT diploma or into first year of selected Deakin University bachelor's degrees.

Who should apply?

Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program is aimed at students who have completed the equivalent of Australian high school Year 11 (see page 22 for country specific academic requirements).

Course structure

The course comprises eight academic units: three core units, three option units and two elective units. Various support services focusing on language, literary and numeracy assistance are also available to help you in your studies.

Each unit includes four hours of class contact per week. Assessment for all units is continuous, and includes tests, assignments and case study analysis. Most units have a final three hour examination. To be awarded the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program, you must complete and pass all eight academic units.

Course accreditation

The Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program is accredited by the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA). Successful completion of this qualification is recognised within the Australian Qualifications Framework.

Certificate to diploma transfer criteria

After successfully completing the certificate, and provided you have met the following criteria, you will be eligible to enter the relevant MIBT diploma course:

- completed and passed the eight required certificate units;
- a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of at least 50 percent, taking into account all units attempted at MIBT.

Certificate to Deakin University first year entry

After successfully completing the certificate, and meeting specified entry requirements, you may be eligible to apply for entry into the first year of selected Deakin University bachelor's degrees that do not follow directly from MIBT diploma courses. Entry requirements: (Certificate to Deakin University first year entry)

Complete and pass all eight units of the Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program:

- (a) with an overall average of 70 percent and an overall IELTS score of 6, with minimum band scores of 6
- (b) with an overall average of 75 percent for the Mass Communication stream, a score of 80 percent or above for the Communication Skills III (COM202) and Mathematics (BUS104) units, and an overall IELTS score of 7 with minimum band scores of 7
- (c) with an overall average of 70 percent and a score of 75 percent or above in the Communication Skills II (COM201) and Communication Skills III (COM202) units
- (d) with an overall average of 70 percent and an overall IELTS score of 7, with minimum band scores of 7
- (e) with an overall average of 76.5 percent and obtain a score of 75 percent or above in the units Communication Skills II (COM201) and Communication Skills III (COM202) units
- (f) with an overall average of 60 percent and a score of 75 percent or above in the Communication Skills II (COM201) and Communication Skills III (COM202) units

Diploma courses (university level)

MIBT offers diplomas in Commerce, Computing, Engineering, Health Sciences, Management, Media and Communication, and Science. These courses aim to prepare you for entry into second year of a relevant bachelor's degree, as well as providing a suitable qualification for employment purposes.

Who should apply?

The diploma courses are aimed at students who have completed the MIBT Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program; the equivalent of Australian high school Year 12; or a selected post-secondary certificate or diploma (see page 22 for country specific academic requirements).

Course structure

Each diploma consists of eight academic units, which you must complete and pass to receive the diploma. Most units have four hours of class contact per week. Assessment for all units is ongoing and continuous, and includes tests, assignments and case study analysis. Most units have a final two-hour examination.

Course accreditation

The diploma courses are accredited by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA).

Diploma to degree transfer criteria

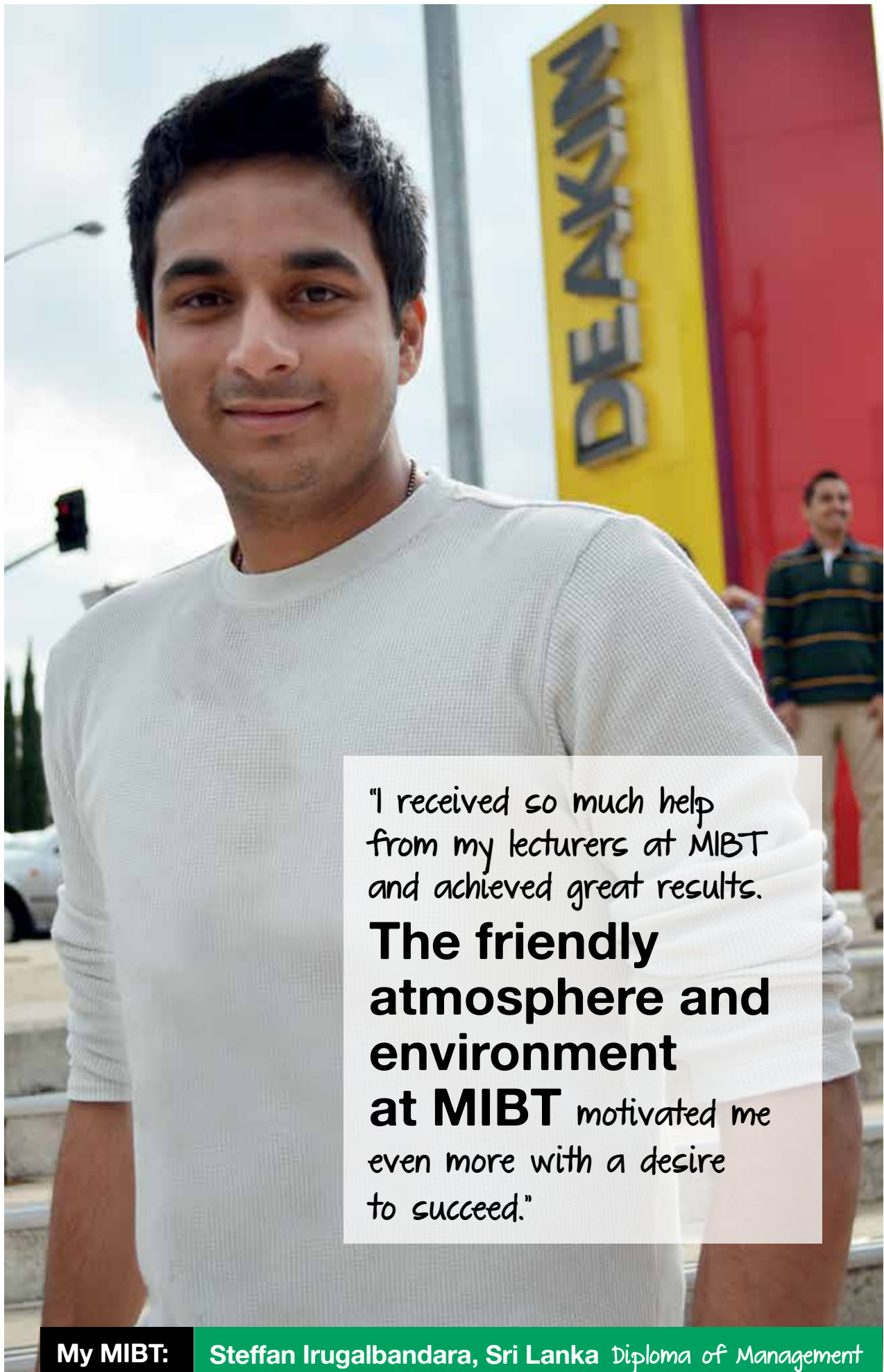

Pathway to postgraduate studies

Postgraduate Qualifying Program (Business and Law)

The Postgraduate Qualifying Program (Business and Law) (PQP) offers a quality pathway to selected Deakin University Business master's courses. The PQP is taught by MIBT and Deakin University's English Language Institute (DUELI). This non-award program provides a quality pathway to Deakin University's postgraduate Business courses.

Who should apply?

The PQP is designed for international students whose academic qualifications and/or English proficiency levels are marginally below the entry requirements for coursework master's programs.

Entry requirements

- **Academic requirements:** To enter the PQP you need to have completed a minimum of a three-year bachelor's degree, or an equivalent postsecondary school qualification.

- **English requirements:** Your IELTS (Academic module) test score (or equivalent) must be 6.0 or above, with no individual band score less than 6.0.

Course structure

The PQP comprises four units, which are studied over one trimester. You must complete two discipline-based units and two units focusing on English language and academic skills. Each unit includes four hours of teaching per week: a two hour lecture followed by a two hour tutorial.

Transferring to Deakin University

If you successfully complete the PQP (in your first attempt) with the required level of achievement, you will meet Deakin University's entry requirements for specified Deakin postgraduate coursework programs, see below for transfer criteria.

Transfer entry criteria

To be eligible for entry into a Deakin postgraduate programs, you must successfully complete all four PQP units and achieve a minimum credit grade of 60 percent in the two discipline-based units undertaken (MAA103, MAE102, MAF101 or MMM132). Students seeking admission to the Master of International Business must also have completed studies in a business-related discipline at post-secondary level. To be eligible for the Master of Business Administration (International) and associated combined degree courses, you must successfully complete all four PQP units with an average mark of 65 percent and a minimum credit grade (60 percent) in the two discipline-based units (MAA103, MAE102, MAF101 or MMM132).

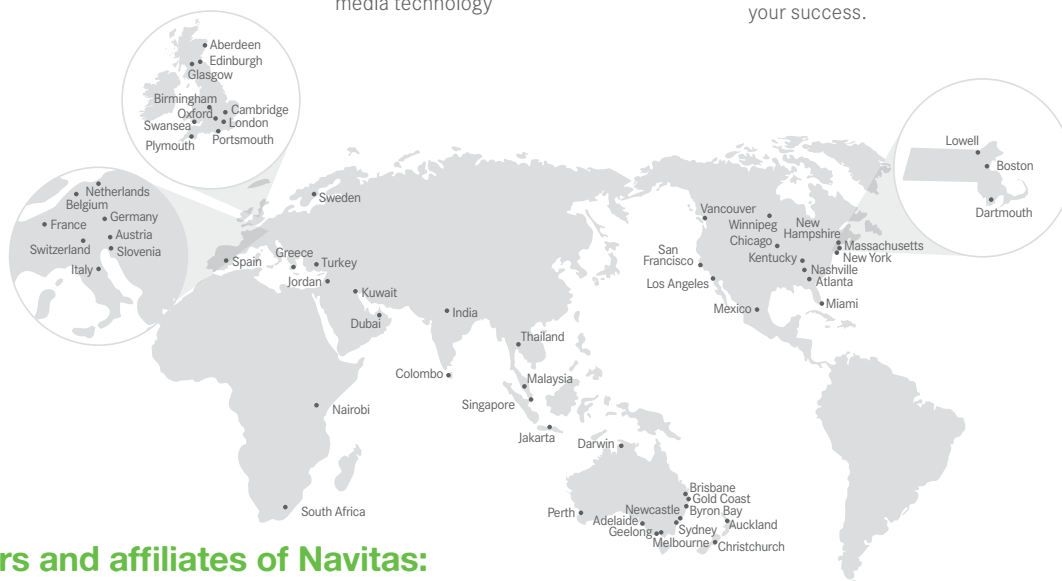
