Graduate with a Macquarie University degree

Students who study at Macquarie City Campus graduate with an internationally respected Macquarie University degree. Graduation ceremonies are held at North Ryde, with students from both campuses attending the same ceremony.

Internships

Macquarie City Campus offers internships for students wishing to gain workplace experience while completing their degree. Internships provide you with on-the-job training and practical work experience in the convenient setting of Sydney's vibrant central business district. These work placements increase your potential to gain employment in your field of study and to start earning sooner upon graduation. Flexible start dates

Macquarie City Campus offers three intakes per year for undergraduate degrees, so you have the potential to complete your bachelor degree in two years rather than the standard three. International students are expected to enrol in a full-time load each session.

Foundation Program

Course content

While studying the Foundation Program you will be exposed to a high-level of learning through a range of methods, including lectures and tutorials, presentations, group work and assignments. The time you spend having face-to-face teaching varies, but a typical class timetable is 26 to 29 hours each week. We recommend you spend approximately 10 to 20 hours per week outside formal classes on self-directed studies.

Support services

At Macquarie City Campus we have thought of everything to make your time with us enjoyable and successful. We have designed the program to ensure you get the support to keep your studies on track. You will benefit from our small class sizes, additional course material and academic support. We have a dedicated team of highly skilled staff who can answer your queries, organise your studies, help you select the right courses, and manage any other issues you may encounter.

Duration

The Foundation Program is two sessions (eight months) or three sessions (12 months), depending on your most recent high school results. You have the flexibility to commence in February, June or October.

Assessment methods

Assessment in the Foundation Program encourages learning and indicates your level of achievement against set criteria, standards and learning objectives. Grades are awarded and are achieved by completing various assessments and tasks. Assessment methods vary depending on the course and units selected. We use a combination of assessment techniques, including individual and group assignments, essays, oral presentations, tutorial participation and formal examinations.

English support

If applicable, you will be able to undertake the academic English program. The fast-track (eight month) program consists of 208 contact hours of English language support, combined with 100 hours of regular, supervised and self-directed study. In addition, you will have a minimum of five contact hours per week for each unit which consists of lectures, seminars, tutorials and supervised study.

The standard-track (12 month) program consists of 401 contact hours of English language support and an additional 130 hours of tertiary preparation. Both programs encompass the Australian learning and teaching environment which provides you with the skills and capabilities suitable for entry to Macquarie University. A greater focus is placed on the development of academic English and communication skills required for further study at the tertiary level, including writing, research and seminar presentation, and participation skills.

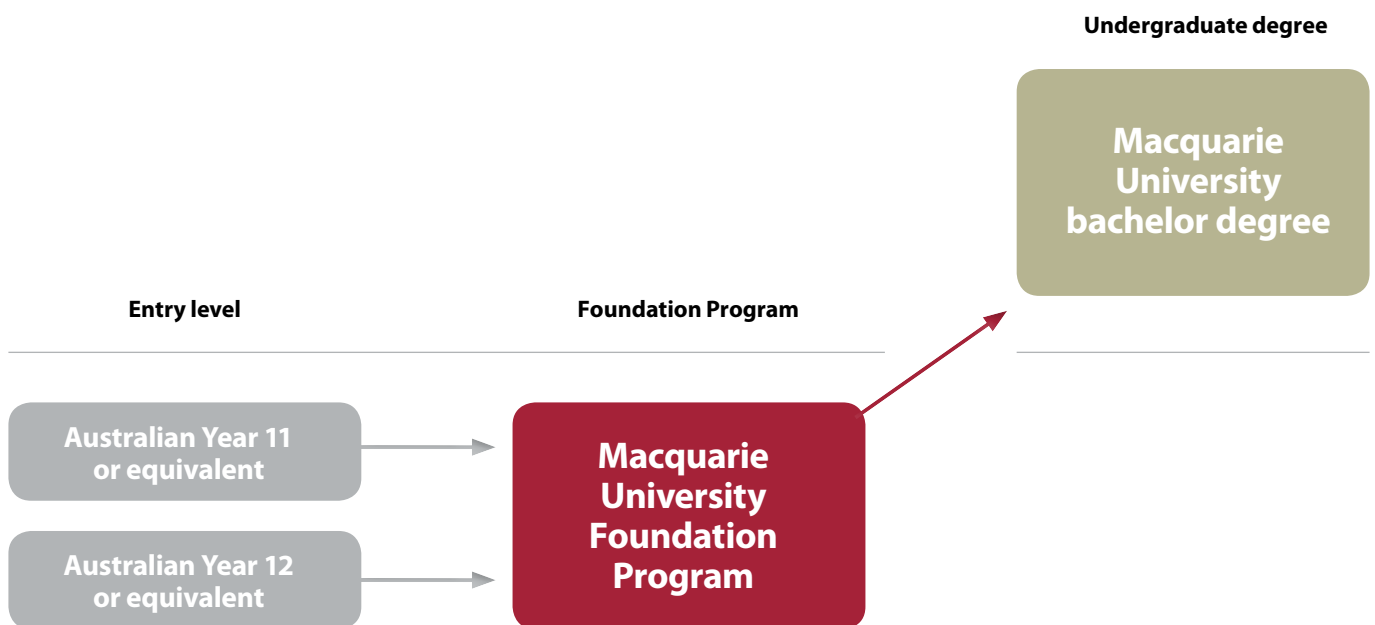

Entry to your Macquarie degree

When you successfully complete your Macquarie University Foundation Program to the required level, you can articulate into a bachelor degree at the North Ryde or city campus.

We assess your academic progress throughout each session and in final exams, with our lecturers regularly providing feedback on your progress. Assessment is a mixture of group and individual assignments and exams. The following two pages are a guide to the academic scores and prior knowledge required for entry into a Macquarie bachelor degree. 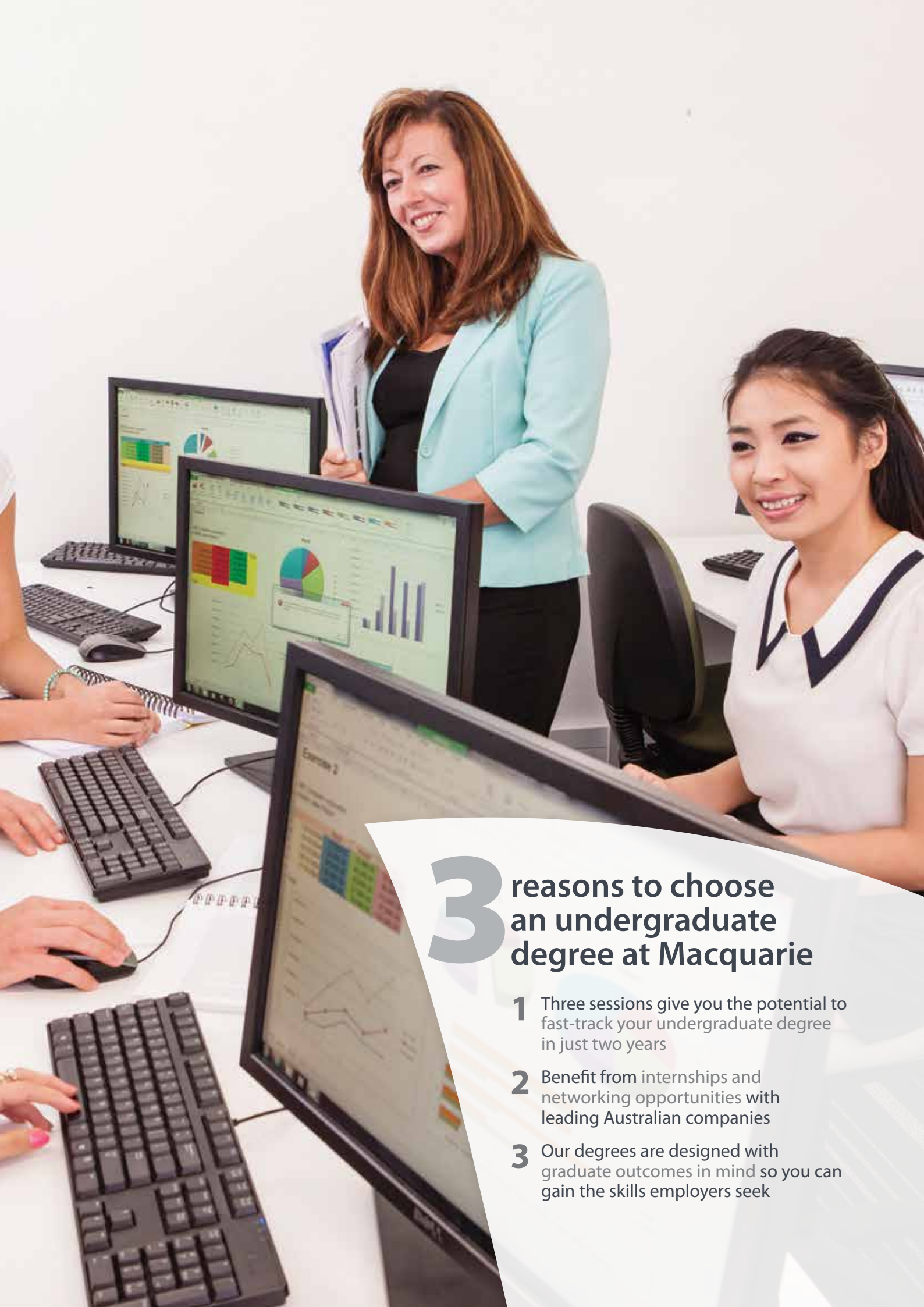

Undergraduate degrees

Broad educational experience

Macquarie University's interdisciplinary approach to study teaches you to think more broadly, to tackle the big questions in life and the things that really matter to society. Our curriculum ensures that you are better equipped with the skills required to compete in the global economy, by providing you with a broader academic and social experience.

Degree structure

You must complete a minimum number of credit points over two or three years to qualify for your degree. Undergraduate degrees at Macquarie City Campus require the completion of the following number of credit points:

- Bachelor of Arts majoring in Media, Culture and Communication (69 credit points)
- Bachelor of Business Administration (72 credit points)
- Bachelor of Commerce – Professional Accounting (69 credit points)

Capstone units

Each undergraduate degree contains a capstone unit which is completed towards the end of your degree. This unit synthesises all the related areas of learning that you have completed throughout your degree to develop problem-solving skills and prepare you for life after graduating.

Teaching and assessment

You will attend two to five hours of classroom-based lectures and tutorials a week per unit (subject), depending on the unit.

To pass each unit you will be assessed by a range of methods including examinations, group work, assignments, research and oral presentations.

Description

This degree consists of core and elective units that allow you to meet the requirements for professional industry accreditation. The professional accounting sequence meets the tertiary education requirements of CPA Australia for 'CPA' status, the Institute of Chartered Accountants Australia (ICAA) for 'CA' status and the Institute of Public Accountants (IPA) for 'PNA' status. It provides an excellent foundation for a range of accounting-based careers. It also satisfies the requirements of the Foundation level qualification of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA).

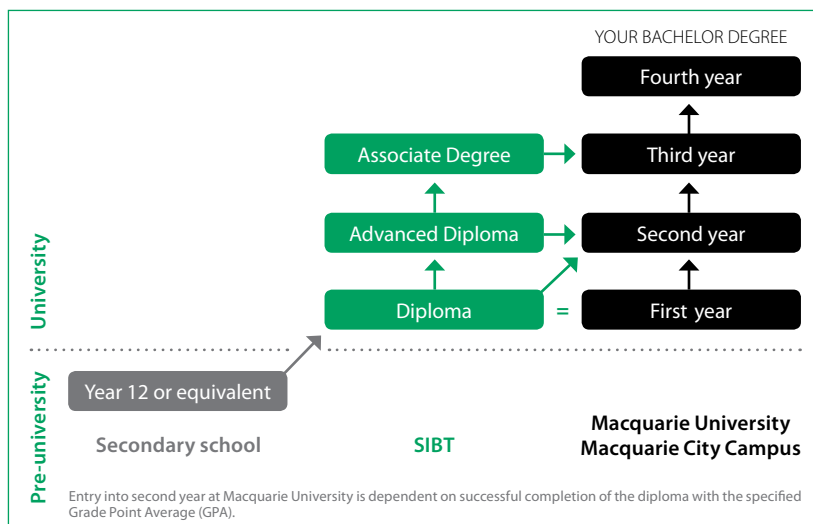

Our scholarships your financial boost

To assist you in your studies, Macquarie City Campus and Navitas offer a range of bursaries that provide real support.

Navitas bursary

Navitas offers financial support in the form of family bursaries. A bursary applies where two or more students from the same family study with a Navitas member institution[^].

The first family member can be studying with a Navitas member institution at the same time as other family members, or may have previously studied with any Navitas member institution. For the purpose of this bursary, a family member is defined as a husband, wife, brother, sister, mother, father, son, daughter or stepchild.

The bursary is granted to the second and subsequent family members who study with a Navitas member institution.

The bursary is equivalent to 10 per cent of tuition for the first attempt at units in the program of study i.e. certificate[#], diploma[#], bachelor degree, pre-masters program/PQP, or masters degree with a Navitas member institution (excluding mixed English option) and is credited to the eligible student's tuition fee account each session (the amount being relevant to the number of units undertaken in that session). The bursary does not apply to additional units or repeat units that may also be undertaken.

Macquarie City Campus Navitas academic merit scholarships

Macquarie City Campus and Navitas are committed to helping students achieve their career goals by offering scholarships to outstanding students.

This scholarship is awarded each session for the most outstanding results from a student studying in the Foundation Program and two students across undergraduate/postgraduate degrees. The scholarships are tuition fee waivers for one academic session.

The recipients of the scholarships will be notified upon the completion of each session and the release of the results. Students must take a minimum of 12 credit points to qualify for the scholarships and have achieved an overall minimum GPA of 3.5 across undergraduate/postgraduate degrees (for which the scholarship is applied). Students studying the Foundation Program must achieve a weighted overall program average (OPA) minimum of 75 at the end of the current study period.

How to apply

1. Note the eligibility requirements for both scholarships
2. Use your student number to apply for the scholarships using the online application form

Note:

- Students are eligible to qualify for the scholarship after successful completion of their first session and after beginning their second session
- Students can only be awarded the scholarship once
- The scholarship is applied to tuition for the students' final session of study in a Foundation Program/an undergraduate/postgraduate degree
- Students are required to pay for any additional degrees/units undertaken over and above the amount covered by the scholarship

Working after graduation: the Temporary Graduate visa

From 2013, students who have studied in Australia for two years and graduate with an eligible Australian qualification can apply for a Temporary Graduate visa (subclass 485) through the Post Study Work stream, allowing them to gain valuable industry experience in Australia before returning home. The visa length will vary from two years for bachelor degree graduates to four years for PhD graduates. Graduates with qualifications that relate to an occupation on the Australian Government's Skilled Occupation List can also apply for a Temporary Graduate visa through the Graduate Work stream. A visa in this stream is granted for 18 months.

Homestay

Tuition fees for Australian students

Commonwealth Supported Place

A Commonwealth Supported Place is a higher education place for which the Australian Government makes a contribution to your education provider towards the cost of your education. If you are enrolled in an undergraduate unit as a Commonwealth supported student you will be required to contribute to the cost of your education through a student contribution.

For eligible students, student contribution amounts can be paid through HECS-HELP. To be eligible, you must:

- be enrolled in a unit of study as a Commonwealth supported student; and
- meet the citizenship or residency requirements. That is, you must be
 1. an Australian citizen; or
 2. the holder of a permanent humanitarian visa who will be resident in Australia for the duration of the unit.

HECS-HELP entitles a student to:

- receive a 10 per cent discount for any amount paid in excess of \$500 on or by the census date for the relevant study period. The discount will apply to all of the amount paid including the \$500:
 1. for instance a student who pays \$500 has effectively paid \$562.50
 2. a student whose student contribution amount for the study period is \$2000 would only have to pay \$1800 (\$2000 X 90 per cent) to pay their full fees.
- defer any amount of unpaid fees as at the census date to the Australian Taxation Office for collection under the taxation system. This is dependent on the student having supplied a Tax File Number to the University.

FEE-HELP government loan scheme

FEE-HELP is a loan to assist eligible fee-paying students pay their tuition fees. Australian citizens are eligible for FEE-HELP assistance and can pay their tuition fee in one of three ways:

- full up-front payment
- partial up-front payment and a FEE-HELP loan for the remainder
- obtain a FEE-HELP loan for the full amount

Permanent humanitarian visa holders must reside in Australia for the duration of the course (unless otherwise required by the course) to access FEE-HELP assistance. Students repay their loans through the Australian taxation system once their minimum income is AU\$49,095*.

If you are eligible for FEE-HELP you will receive a 'Request for FEE-HELP assistance' form and a FEE-HELP information booklet with your package offer. To be guaranteed a place you will need to complete and return this form to Macquarie City Campus prior to orientation.

Tuition fees for international students

Tuition fees for international students at Macquarie University are set on a per credit point basis, with your credit point fee depending on the degree in which you are enrolled. In most cases, fees for your first academic session are paid at the time of accepting your offer of study, in the form of a Commencement Fee. Tuition fees for subsequent academic sessions should be paid by the due date in each session.

To help you calculate your likely tuition fees, Macquarie publishes an estimated annual fee for each degree, based on a full-time study load. In most cases this is 16 credit points per academic session or 32 points per year.

The University reviews its per credit point fees each year and may increase them from year to year. It is important to remember that you will pay the fee relevant to the academic year in which you are enrolled, and that you may be subject to other fees and charges.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Compulsory for all students residing in Australia on a student visa, OSHC will help you pay for any medical or hospital care you or your dependents may need while you're in Australia. Macquarie arranges a special OSHC package price with its preferred provider Allianz Global Assistance OSHC, but you are free to choose your own provider. In 2013, OSHC cover for a single person for a 12-month period was approximately \$520. Discounts apply for longer periods and for additional visa holders in a family. Cost of living

To make the most of your Australian study experience, you'll need to allocate enough funds to cover your study and living expenses. Australian student visa regulations require visa applicants to have access to at least AU\$18,610 a year to cover living costs, with additional funds for dependent partners or children. The amount you set aside for your living expenses will depend on the type of lifestyle you want to lead, including living on or off campus, and driving a car or taking public transport. Working while you study

Student visa holders in Australia are entitled to work up to 40 hours per fortnight while their degree is in session, and unlimited hours during scheduled breaks. Casual and part-time job opportunities can be found on campus. The University's Career and Employment Service can assist you with your job search and job application.

Your rights as an international student – the Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) framework

The Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000 and associated legislation is the legal framework governing the responsibility of education institutions towards overseas students.

These laws are known as the ESOS framework and they include:

1. *Education for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000*
2. *Education for Overseas Students (ESOS) Regulations 2000*
3. National Code 2007 – which provides national standards for the conduct of registered providers and the registration of their courses

The ESOS framework benefits two particular groups:

1. It protects overseas students coming to Australia on student visas. It does not cover overseas students on other kinds of visas, nor does it cover students studying at Australian institutions based in other countries.
2. It sets out clear roles and responsibilities for educational institutions wanting to teach overseas students.

The ESOS framework supports the *Migration Act 1958 (Cth)* by reinforcing students' obligations under their student visas, and requiring institutions to monitor students' compliance with their visa obligations.

Macquarie University takes its ESOS obligations seriously, and endeavours to deliver educational services of the highest academic standard and to promote them in the most ethical manner possible. It monitors students' compliance with their visa conditions and reports to the Australian Government wherever a student breaches their obligations. English language requirements

All students studying at Macquarie need to provide proof of English language proficiency. You can demonstrate your proficiency in three different ways.

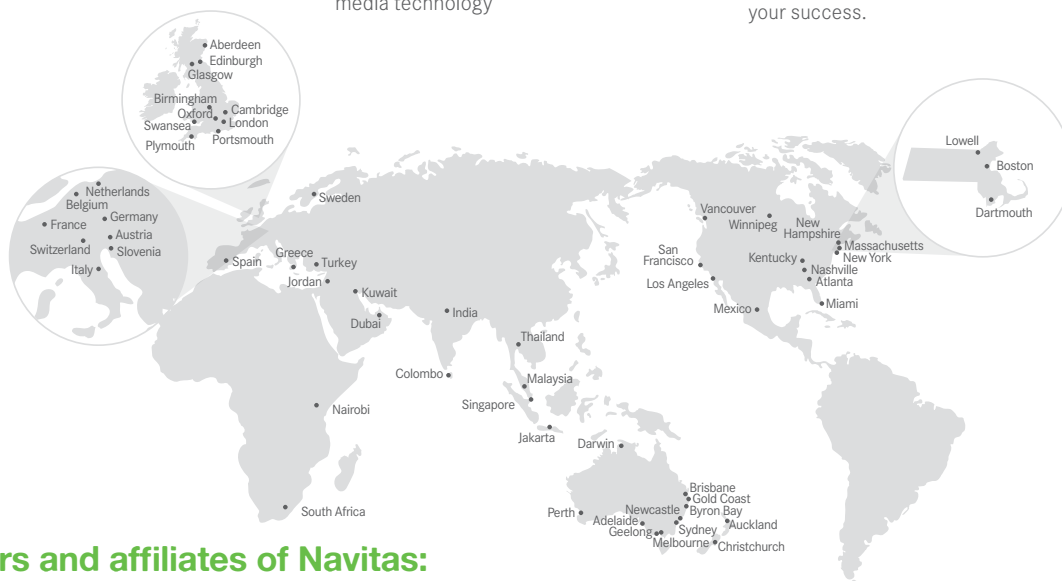
