

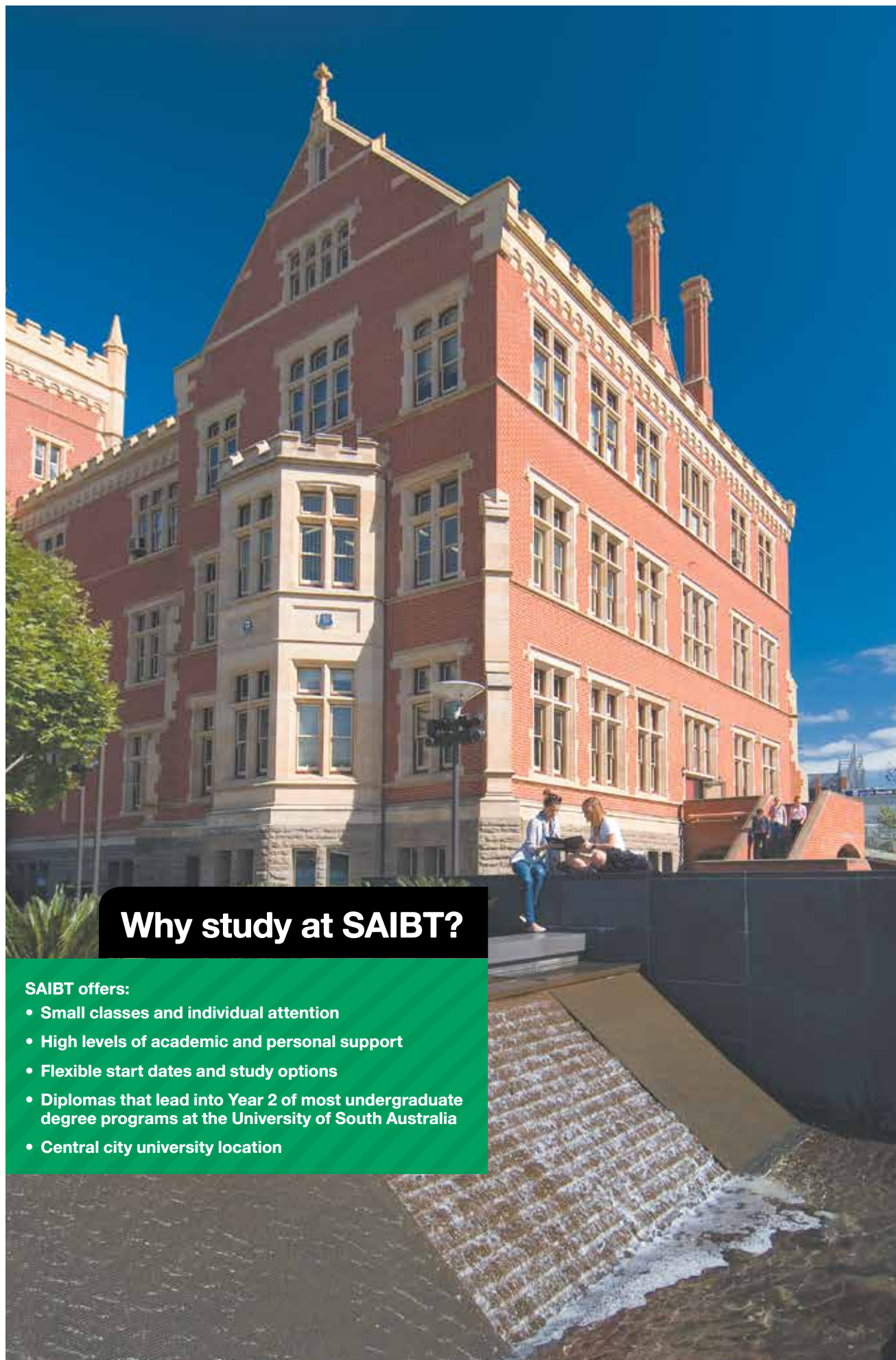

University of South Australia

The University of South Australia is a young institution with an agile, innovative approach to educating tomorrow's professionals and solving today's challenges. As a university of enterprise, its efforts are focused on providing economic and social benefits to the nation and the world.

Formed in 1991 but built on more than 150 years of creating and applying knowledge, the University has quickly established a global reputation for the quality and creativity of its graduates and the innovative, outcomes-focused relevance of its research.

Its global reputation continues to grow. In 2013, both the Times Higher Education (THE) and QS World University Rankings ranked the university in the world's top 50 under the age of 50. QS also placed the university in the world's top three per cent, one of only three Australian institutions under the age of 25 to feature in that world's best list.

With approximately 34,000 students – almost 9,000 of whom are international students – it is South Australia's biggest university, and offers more than 400 degree programs in arts, business, education, engineering, the environment, health sciences, information technology and social sciences. Programs are designed with a strong professional emphasis and in partnership with industry, and its graduate employment rates are above the national average.

The University of South Australia maintains a strong commitment to teaching and learning, and ranks among the highest in Australia for the proportion of its staff with a doctorate.

In addition its MBA program is one of only three in Australia to have held a five-star rating for six consecutive years (as awarded by the Graduate Management Association of Australia) and in the 2013 International Student Barometer the University's overall average rating was in the top five of participating Australian institutions.

The University has urban campuses in the heart of Adelaide and at Mawson Lakes and Magill, and regional campuses in Whyalla and Mount Gambier. The University has recently implemented an extensive building program to further enhance its physical and virtual infrastructure which includes a new \$80 million student learning centre.

Extensive existing campus facilities include 24 hour computer pools, security, support services, student clubs, cafés and sporting facilities. A Campus Central service centre is located on each campus for students seeking help with all aspects of university life.

City Campuses

City East Campus

Situated in the vibrant heart of Adelaide in the CBD, the City East Campus is located on the corner of North Terrace and Frome Road. The campus offers an abundance of hands-on learning opportunities, services and social and leisure activities to complement your academic pursuits.

The campus is home to the University's Division of Health Sciences, SAIBT and the Centre for English Language in the University of South Australia (CELUSA).



City West Campus

Located in Adelaide's major arts, culture and entertainment precinct, City West provides a hub for artists and academics alike, and an atmosphere that is ripe for the exploration of ideas and the pursuit of excellence. The campus is located on the western edge of the CBD, just a short stroll along North Terrace from Adelaide Railway Station.

Mawson Lakes Campus

Located in one of Adelaide's premier developing suburbs, the Mawson Lakes campus boasts contemporary teaching, learning and state-of-the-art research facilities. The campus is located 20 minutes from the Adelaide city centre, on Mawson Lakes Boulevard in Adelaide's northern suburbs.

Magill Campus

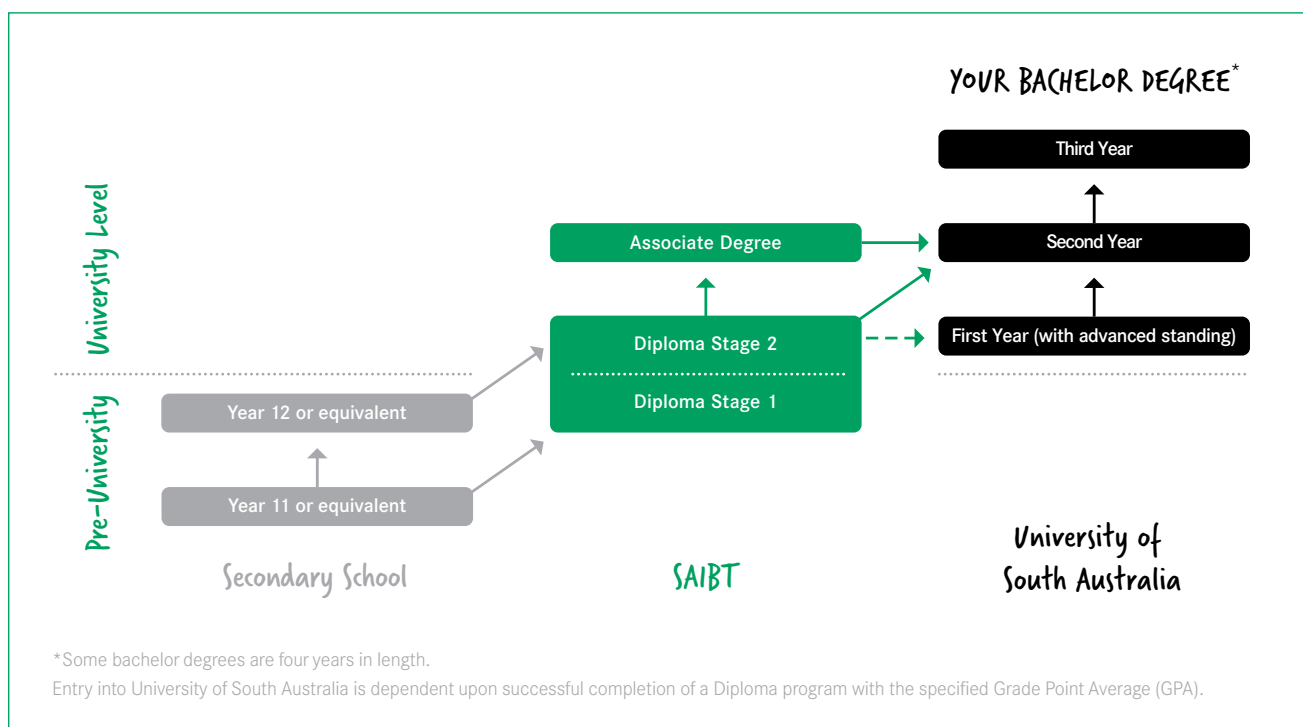

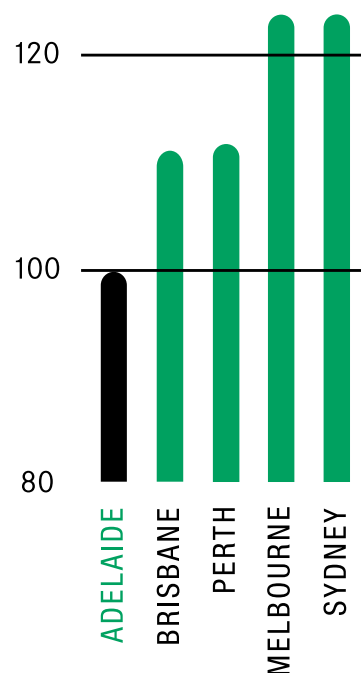
Cost of living

The cost of living in Adelaide is lower than in any other mainland capital city in Australia. Living expenses for an international student in Adelaide will vary depending on individual lifestyle, but can be expected to be:

- 25 percent less expensive than living in Melbourne
- 24 percent less expensive than living in Sydney
- 11 percent less expensive than living in Perth
- 10 percent less expensive than living in Brisbane

Climate

Adelaide offers a Mediterranean climate with four distinct seasons that include hot, dry summers and cool, wet winters.

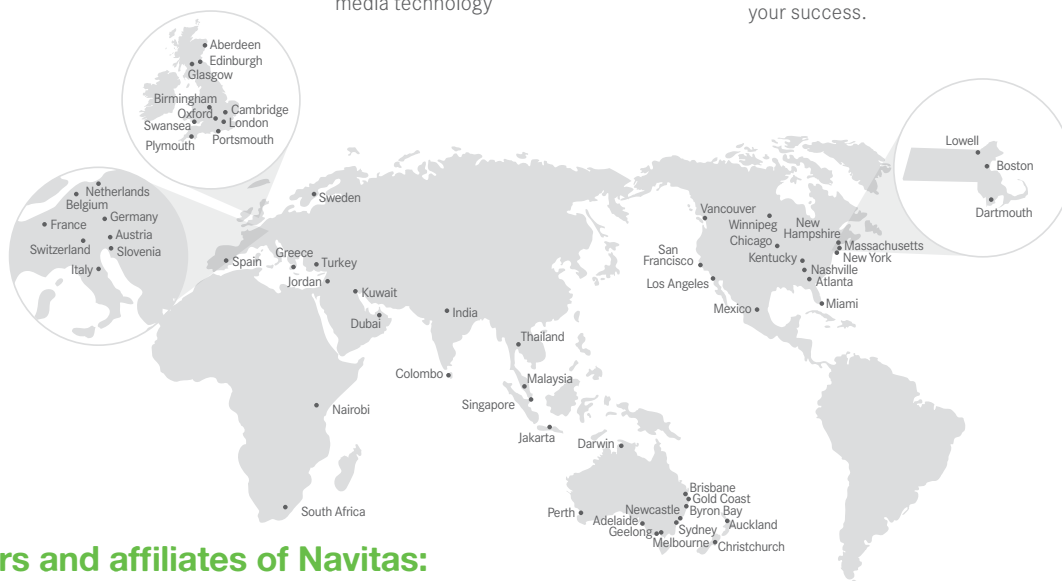
